CONVENTION ROUNDUP

The 2014 General Convention in Houston, Texas, was a grand affair. With a registration list nearing twelve hundred people, attendance was up, and boy did our Texas sisters roll out the red carpet. Hundreds of volunteers along with the local committee of Houston alumnae, saw to every detail and pulled off the perfect event. The meals were lavish, the decorations classy, and the speakers and programs inspired from start to finish. The Kappa Kappa Gamma Foundation raised more than \$250,000 through the Tribute Table, and the Museums Committee held three workshops and staged THREE exhibits! This Convention will be remembered by many for many years to come.



On display were the two Tradition of Leadership[®] exhibits written by Edith Petersilia Mayo, *George Washington*, and designed by Doug Distel. The first, *Education to Enfranchisement – 1870–1920*, is now a Convention favorite since its debut in 2010. The second, *Enfranchisement to Employment – 1920–1970*, is the latest in the series of three and was first opened at the 2014 Convention. The first one hundred years of Kappa Kappa Gamma and the women's movement are presented in the context of the early leaders and members of the organization. Objects include contemporary magazines and books of the period as well as the typewriter of Clara O. Pierce, *Ohio State*, Executive Secretary, 1929–1969, and the banquet dress of Frances Fatout Alexander, *DePauw*, Fraternity President, 1964–1968. Photos by Doug Distel
