

neckties) which also were popular. Badges often were worn on the high boned collars that were fashionable around the turn of the century, and the sought-after Gibson Girl look accommodated the key at the shoulder line or a little lower. From 1910 to 1925 the placement of the key descended steadily almost to the natural waistline as the stylish flapper beltline settled around the hips. By the 1930s, the badge was generally worn on the left side, about six inches below the shoulder. The *Key to Kappa Knowledge*, pledge manual of the 1960s, stipulated this position, but there are no such dictates for today's members.

Some Kappas wear the badges of friends or relatives. Most wear badges which have been ordered for them by their chapters. Some Kappas own several keys. The three keys of Amy Rhodes Livoni, late of Brooklyn, New York, have been returned to Fraternity Headquarters. Amy was initiated into Psi Chapter at Cornell in 1903. One of her keys is plain, with black enameled letters; one is decorated with opals and also lettered in black; the other is adorned with diamonds and raised gold letters.

The story of the badge would be incomplete without some reference to the development of its companion, the pledge pin. The modern member wears the "sigma delta pin" before she attains the privilege of the key, but the pledge pin was not the historical precursor of the badge.

Kappas of the 1870s and 1880s were initiated so shortly

after pledging that no special pin was deemed necessary, although knots of grosgrain ribbon in the Fraternity or chapter colors were pinned on future members as early as 1875. As time went on, it became customary to use the stickpins worn as guards for badges as pledge pins. At first they bore the Greek letters of chapter names, but after 1890 the KKΓ monogram and fleur-de-lis came into vogue.

Carla Sargent Fisk, deputy to Kappa's grand president from 1894 to 1896, designed the sigma within delta, which was adopted as a Fraternity symbol at the 1894 Convention. Katharine Sharp, the grand president, had the design made into a stickpin cut from flat gold and presented it to Carla. She urged its adoption as a pledge pin, but the monogram continued to gain favor and was accepted at the 1902 Convention as the official pledge pin. Two years later the sigma in delta was approved also, so chapters could choose whichever they preferred. Any size, usually with a light blue delta framing a dark blue sigma, was permitted for the next 10 years. Nor was any particular size specified for the monogram. Finally it was determined in 1914 that a light blue sigma within a dark blue delta, measuring three/eighth inch per side, should be the Fraternity's only pledge pin. In 1926 the basic metal of the pin was changed from gold to silver. No further changes have occurred. Upon initiation, the pledge pin is returned to the chapter.

National Panhellenic Conference Passes Important Resolutions Concerning All Members

The following Resolutions were passed by the National Panhellenic Conference delegates at the Interim Meeting in December, 1978:

RESOLUTION 1.

The National Panhellenic Conference has operated WHEREAS, on annual dues of \$75.00 (seventy-five dollars) per member group and the per capita chapter tax of \$2.25 (two dollars and twenty-five cents) since

1969; and,

WHEREAS. There has been a continued rise in printing, postage and other administrative costs which make it impossible to provide an adequate budget for the needs of the Conference;

RESOLVED, That Article VIII, Section 2 of the By-Laws be amended by striking out the phrase: "\$75.00 plus \$2.25" and inserting \$100.00 plus \$2.75."

The effect of this amendment will be to raise the annual dues and the per capita chapter tax by approximately 25% each.

RESOLUTION 2.

RESOLVED, That the STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT Statement 9, be amended by deleting the words "any agreement" and substituting in lieu thereof, the words "all Unanimous Agreements"; deleting the word "has" and substituting in lieu thereof, the word "have"; deleting the words "either by the College Panhellenic or"; inserting the word "member" after the word "the" and before the word "fraternities"; deleting the word "through" and substituting in lieu thereof the words "of the"; that present Statement 9, be renumbered to become Statement 1.

Statement 1 to then read:

"National Panhellenic Conference fraternities shall impress upon their members that they shall respect and obey the letter and the spirit of all Unanimous Agreements which have been made by the member fraternities of the National Panhellenic Conference."

RESOLUTION 3.

RESOLVED, That the STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT Statement 6 be repealed. Statement 6 reads: "National Panhellenic Conference fraternities shall unite in assisting local groups in colleges and universities to obtain national charters."

> Justification: Statements 4 and 5, STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT, appear to adequately cover the subject. Policy statements, model constitutions, extension procedures include references to local groups. The words "shall unite" imply an intrustion on the rights of the local groups, and at odds with Statement 4.

RESOLUTION 4.

RESOLVED, That the STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT Statement 7 be repealed. Statement 7 reads: "Visiting officers of National Panhellenic Conference fraternities shall be expected not to interfere with regular routine work of the college, but, on the contrary, they shall encourage chapters to keep the college business day free from social engagements.

> Justification: Inappropriate as a Unanimous Agreement. Lacks dignity. Intrudes on the prerogatives of member fraternities to advise their own national of-

RESOLUTION 5.

RESOLVED, That the STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT Statement 12 be repealed. Statement 12 reads: "National Panhellenic Conference approves the merit system of election and appointment and disapproves unethical political practices, such as block

> Justification: Over-generalization. Confusing. Some relate it to College Panhellenic elections (instead of rotation), others to general campus elections, state and national elections.

RESOLUTION 6.

RESOLVED, That STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT Statement 11, be amended by substituting a semi-colon for the period, after the word "requirements" and adding "or where the school administration has specifically stated that it disapproves of the establishment of women's fraternities on that campus.'

Statement 11 would then read:

"National Panhellenic Conference believes that it is unethical for an NPC fraternity to contact a school and/or its students concerning extension when the school fails to meet the NPC requirements; or to establish a chapter where the school administration has specifically stated that it disapproves of the establishment of women's fraternities on that campus."

RESOLUTION 7.

RESOLVED. That "the Revisions Committee be empowered to properly number the Statements in the section STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT, in accordance with any changes which might arise as a result of 1978 Conference action."

RESOLUTION 8.

RESOLVED, That COLLEGE PANHELLENICS AGREEMENT section 3, Preferential Bidding, a., substitute word "card" for "slip" in second line; in section 5, Handling Infractions of Rushing Rules, renumber present f., to become paragraph 2, of 5 a. and delete the words "the above procedures shall then be followed"; present e.2, becomes F.; present 3 becomes G. and present 4 becomes H.

Justification: This is a housekeeping resolution, for clarification. To be consistent, and to afford the appeal mechanism to NPC the dignity it deserves, the alphabetized designation should be used.

RESOLUTION 9.

RESOLVED, The JURISDICTION OF A COLLEGE PANHELLENIC COUNCIL Statement 1, be amended by deleting "as a self-regulating body." The sentence would then read: "A Panhellenic Council, composed of delegates from women's NPC social fraternities, is organized to afford cooperation among women's fraternities."

RESOLUTION 10.

RESOLVED, That JURISDICTION OF A COLLEGE PANHELLENIC COUNCIL include a new Statement, to be numbered Statement 2, "College Panhellenics Constitutions and Bylaws must include, and conform to, the Unanimous Agreements of NPC, and members shall respect and obey the letter and spirit of all Unanimous Agreements made by member fraternities of NPC."

RESOLUTION 11.

RESOLVED, That JURISDICTION OF A COLLEGE PANHELLENIC COUNCIL statements, for clarification, be renumbered as follows: "Present #1, second sentence, will become Statement 3; present #3 will become Statement 5; present #4 will become Statement 6; present #5 will become Statement 7; present #1, third sentence, will become Statement 8.""

The entire section, JURISDICTION OF A COLLEGE PANHELLENIC COUNCIL will then read:

- A Panhellenic Council, composed of delegates from women's NPC social fraternities, is organized to afford cooperation among the women's fraternities.
- A College Panhellenics Constitutions and Bylaws must include, and conform to, the Unanimous Agreements of NPC, and members shall respect and obey the letter and spirit of all Unamimous Agreements made by member fraternities of NPC.
- A Panhellenic Council may take no action which infringes on the sovereignty, rights, or privileges of the individual fraternities.
- 4. A College Panhellenic Council may not require, as a condition of Panhellenic membership, that fraternity chapters maintain a specific scholastic grade point average, nor require that chapters maintain a minimum number of members, nor any other requirement which infringes on the rights and privileges of the individual NPC fraternity.
- A College Panhellenic does not have the authority to poll its member groups regarding the internal operations of the fraternities.
- A College Panhellenic Council may not lower a chapter's pledge quota as a rushing infraction penalty.
- A College Panhellenic Council may not require chapters to be represented by a specific chapter officer. It is the privilege of the individual fraternity chapter to choose its own Panhellenic delegates.
- 8. Except in routine matters, a Panhellenic Council and officers of a Panhellenic Council shall act only upon vote of the delegate body after referral to the member fraternity chapters. Justification:

The only changes in wording occur in the first sentence of present Statement 1, and in addition of the new Statement 2. The remainder is simply a change

of position for better identification, and logical sequence. (You will note the misspelling of the word "sovereignty" as it appeared in the 9th edition Manual has been corrected.)

RESOLUTION 12.

RESOLVED. That "if a College Panhellenic officer is unable to fulfill her full term, and her fraternity is unable to provide a qualified replacement, the fraternity next in rotation shall assume the responsibility for the office; a fraternity filling any unexpired term shall not relinquish its regular rotation order."

RESOLUTION 13.

RESOLVED. That "vacancies in chapter total are not created by the granting of alumnae status to undergraduate members except when a member group is recolonizing."

(This resolution is to be added to the section entitled (Chapter Membership Roll in "HOW TO.")

RESOLUTION 14.

WHEREAS. A College Panhellenic Council may recommend the number of invitations a chapter may issue to a rush party

RESOLVED, That it is the right of the individual fraternity chapter to determine the number of invitations it will extend.

RESOLUTION 15.

WHEREAS, Costs of health care are continuing to spiral, and WHEREAS, Many members of the National Panhellenic Conference are not eligible for group insurance through any other channel, and

WHEREAS, Group excess major medical and Medical supplemental plans are available at low group rates; therefore, be it

RESOLVED. The Executive Committee be authorized to designate an Insurance Administrator to formulate a proposal for group major medical insurance program which will be presented at the next biennial conference.

RESOLUTION 16.

WHEREAS, There is an obvious lack of quality research in the fraternity area and this research, properly conceived and directed, can be beneficial to both the fraternity world and higher education, and

WHEREAS, There is need for continued educational programs directed at fraternity leaders, alumni volunteers, professional staff, and university administration; therefore be it

RESOLVED, The National Panhellenic Conference endorse a Center for the Study of the College Fraternity to further excellence in both fraternities and sororities and to support programs within the fraternity system in harmony with the broad mission of higher education

Justification: We are the only conference which has not endorsed this concept.

RESOLUTION 17.

WHEREAS. There exists a very real need to safeguard the spirit and intent of the Rules of Ethical Conduct as well as all the Unanimous Agreements of the National Panhellenic Conference, and

WHEREAS, Violations can result in jeopardizing the welfare of every member group; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That a committee be appointed by the Executive Committee of NPC to study the problem and return its recommendations for dealing with it to the regular 1979 session of the Conference.

RESOLUTION 18.

RESOLVED, That STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT include a new statement. It is unethical for an NPC Fraternity to establish a chapter on a campus without the approval of the proper authority.




A Sisterhood to Share

Legacy is a Key to Sharing Sisterhood

In the fraternity world the term legacy is widely used to mean "something coming from an ancestor or predecessor" and most specifically for Kappas means that the rushee has either a sister, mother, or grandmother who is an initiated Kappa. There is often a built-in loyalty to the Fraternity and a stronger impetus for membership than there might be in non-legacies.

When the numbers enrolled on various campuses for rush are analyzed, one learns that more and more legacies have entered the picture. Often the rushee is a legacy to more than one Panhellenic group (with connections to sometimes four or five different Greek organizations). In at least four cases this past year the number of Kappa legacies enrolled in rush exceeded the number of spaces available for pledging in the chapter quota.

Sharing a legacy is getting to be a habit enjoyed by Janet Nichols Bass, BA—Illinois, and her daughter Julie Bass, also Beta Lambda. They now claim 27 Kappas along their family tree and feel a real sense of pride in the sisterhood.

Through the years Kappa has continued to seek as members young women who are in sympathy with our purposes as stated in the *Preamble* to the *Constitution:* who are able to achieve some measure of scholastic success; who, sharing agreement in fundamentals with other members of a chapter, enrich the life of the group and grow as persons through the experience; and who act now as responsible campus citizens and who will, as alumnae, become contributing members of society.

Since the Fraternity is a highly personal and closely knit organization, we believe that members should be selected who are qualified to further its aims and purposes. Members should be selected on the basis of good character, sound scholarship, and basic congeniality. The selection

of members is a basic right of voluntary associations in a free society and that this right should be respected.

Membership is for life not just for the undergraduate years; therefore it is a shared responsibility. A Fraternity is only as strong as its membership. Alumnae have the privilege to recommend qualified girls in their communities and actives have the responsibility of selecting new members. Actives and alumnae work as a team.





It all started when some of the alumnae felt that although their social life for several months of the year revolves around university sports events, there were no appropriate cocktail napkins. Trish Cross Koza, ΓI —Washington U., creates needlepoint designs as a hobby and had previously done an aggressive hawk superimposed on a diagonal I. (Incidentally, she had created it as an especially masculine design for her husband, John, when he expressed an interest in needlepoint.) This design, in black on gold, was used with a "Go Hawks" border, and an order for 30,000 napkins was placed with a local advertising company.

Despite some nervous anticipation, the napkins "sold themselves" at \$2.25 for a package of 50 and were shipped as far as California to loyal IU Hawkeye fans.

After all, paper napkins may not last long but alumni sports fans provide a steady market.





Winner of two Olympic gold medals, she was called "the finest all-round swimmer in the world." Her photogenic face adorned the covers of *Time, Life, The Saturday Evening Post*, and *Sports Illustrated*. In 1964 *Donna de Varona*, $\Gamma \Xi - U.C.L.A.$, was voted America's Outstanding Woman Athlete by the AP and UPI, and in 1969 was inducted into the International Swimming Hall of Fame.

Today Donna has signed a two-year contract with NBC-TV to do exclusive coverage of the 1980 Olympics. She became network television's first female sportscaster when she joined ABC Sports in 1965 after retiring from her swimming career at age seventeen.

This phenomenal Kappa will celebrate her 32nd birthday on April 26. Born in San Diego, California, she spent much of her early life in the San Francisco area. Her starting block to setting eighteen world records in swimming was a pool near the de Varona home in Lafayette, California. Donna began not as a swimmer but a diver, under coach Frank McGuigan. Then her older brother David began swimming at the Las Lomas High School pool as therapy for an injured knee, and Donna went along. At Las Lomas swimming was "not serious," she says, "just organized." In the little races she found herself finishing ahead of all the other little racers, and in 1957 at age ten she begged her father to take her to the Far Western AAU meet in San Francisco.

Donna's father, Dave de Varona, played tackle for the 1937 California Rose Bowl Team, and later for the San Diego Bombers. Sports are his greatest interest and he was delighted with Donna's swimming aspirations.

Recollections of her first meet are: "I remember how happy my dad and I were as we drove to the meet. He kept assuring me that I could finish third and I was sure I could. There were so many people from everywhere—even Hawaii. We arrived

there in the morning but they kept putting off my race. I was getting tired, hungry, and I guess, scared. It was seven at night before I raced."

"I got up on the starting blocks and false-started. Four more times I jumped the gun. Once I swam the whole pool. I must have false-started about eighteen times. I didn't know how to go down in a regular start. Finally we raced and I finished in a tie for tenth place. I swam back to my dad and he tells me I had tears in my eyes when I told him to give me another chance."

Then Donna really started training. Swimming demands the most strenuous training of any sport. Every day before and after school young Donna would swim a total of four hours. Success in competition depends on two things—condition and mental attitude. "When you know you're doing 600-800 miles a year training, it gives you confidence," she said. "A 400-meter race doesn't look so long."

When Donna first appeared as a serious competitor she was a tiny 5'2" and 100 pounds. Standing beside other women swimmers of 140 pounds she appeared an unlikely candidate for a ribbon. Her father can remember Donna being picked up and deposited on the lane ropes by the wave of a larger woman's starting dive!

In April 1960 she arrived at her first National meet in Bartlesville, Oklahoma, three inches taller and 127 pounds. Then thirteen years old, she became the youngest member of the 1960 American Olympic team which went to Rome. On July 15, 1960, at Indianapolis, Donna set her first world record. It was in the medley event at the national championships.

The individual medley event is sometimes described as the "Decathlon of Swimming." It is Donna's favorite race. It requires a swimmer to do the butterfly, the backstroke, the breaststroke, and the freestyle. She considers it a "thinking" race. The medley event was not in the Olympic programme at that time. If it had been, Donna would have become the youngest Olympic swimming champion.

Between 1960 and 1964 Donna set eighteen world records en route to the Tokyo Olympics. To prepare for the Olympics the U.S. Women began spending 25 hours a week in rigorous practice. Using a system called "interval training" they sprint a series of set distances at full speed, with only a few seconds rest in between. The system develops strength and stamina to awesome levels.

Few Olympic swimming victories have ever been as decisive as was Donna's at Tokyo in 1964. On October 17 she won the first gold medal ever awarded to a woman for the Olympic 400-meter medley. Her time was 5:18.7, an Olympic record.

Donna describes her night before the Olympic swim: "Before I go to sleep at night I swim that race in my mind. I've got my head on the pillow and suddenly I'm in that Tokyo pool. I say to myself, 'What have those seven years of work been for? You know you're in shape. There is no reason anyone should beat you. Now relax, come on, relax. What will people say? You've got to have guts. Think when you swim.' Then the gun goes off.

"I know how I want to feel in the water. It hurts. It doesn't feel good. It's not a smooth hurt, but when I'm good and everything is right it just hurts terribly. You push yourself and go more because you hurt so good. My plan will be to get as much as I can out of every stroke.

"The butterfly is first and I swim it easy. It doesn't take anything out of me. I can swim it easy and it takes more out of the others trying to keep up with me. I know I can beat all of them in the 'fly and they have to strain to keep up.

"Then I hit the backstroke. It and the 'fly are my strongest strokes. I know I've got to get a good lead because some of the other girls have a stronger freestyle. I love the race now. I'm on top and I feel like I'm floating. It's great; the water is great.

"Now it's the breaststroke. I try to swim smooth and efficiently. That's the thing about this one—if you strain, you'll be ruined. So I hang on and keep my rhythm. Everyone else will have to strain to catch me and I'll be fresher for that last 100 freestyle.

"My strength is up, but I can't slow down. I've got to think and I've got to breathe. When I hit that last turn I should be all ready to go. That's what I'm here for—to get that gold medal, boy. It's freestyle. Gung ho. Guts out. Let's make it home!"

Donna de Varona's second 1964 Olympic gold medal came in the 400-meter freestyle relay. She swam the second leg and, with her teammates, set a world record of 4:03.8. She was named by AP and UPI as America's Woman Athlete of 1964. Looking back, she can believe she really did it all. She thinks of the thousands of hours training as "shared drudgery" with other champion swimming friends. Now a resident of New York City, Donna still swims three or four times a week at the Park Pool. She keeps one gold medal in her apartment and her parents display the other one.

At age seventeen she retired from her swimming career and became network television's first female sportscaster. Concurrently with her new career she enrolled at UCLA. Donna wanted to have a normal college life, despite the fact that she was a worldwide celebrity. That is one reason she sought out a sorority.

Donna confessed, "My pledge class terrorized the campus. For one big prank we stole the Beta Theta Pi Bell. Our picture with the bell appeared in the yearbook with the caption 'For whom the bell tolls.' I loved the Kappa house and lived there my sophomore, junior, and senior years. I still keep in touch with many of my sisters, including Kathy Beban, who is married to UCLA All-American football great Gary Beban."

Graduating from UCLA with a degree in Political Science, Donna once thought she might be a lawyer, but the broadcasting bug bit hard. While at ABC-TV her assignments included coverage of three Olympic Games. She also wrote and co-produced three prime-time television specials and wrote and hosted a segment on Dorothy Hamill.

If she weren't in broadcasting Donna would probably run for political office. She has been involved in several administrations in various capacities. When Hubert Humphrey was Vice President he recruited Donna to serve on his task force to improve inner-city recreation. Then she became a member of the President's Council on Physical Fitness. She has served on the council for several terms. In July President Carter appointed her to the President's National Advisory Committee for Women.

Donna left ABC in 1976 to become special counsel for the U.S. Senate's Commerce Committee working on the passage of the 1978 Amateur Athletic Act. She helped write the bill, which is designed to restructure amateur sport in the United States to make our athletes more competitive with salaried Iron Curtain country athletes. The three main tenets of the bill concern an athletes' bill of rights, U.S. Government funding, and women's rights. The bill was sponsored by Senator Stephens of Alaska, whose Kappa wife, a close friend of Donna, was killed in a plane crash.

She is also working with the Department of Health, Education and Welfare and is on the New York State Sports Task Force.

One of Donna's favorite people to work with is Bruce Jenner, 1976 Olympic decathlon champion, who is like a brother to her. "He is just a super down-to-earth person with a very positive attitude," Donna confided. She has done many TV shows with Bruce.

Since she joined NBC Sports in January 1977 she has worked on many assignments for "SportsWorld," and co-hosted with O. J. Simpson the Special Olympics. A regular contributor to the NFL '78 Pregame Show, she was also seen on the Super Bowl football specials.

Recently Donna worked on NBC's Olympic Diary—"The American Way," shot on location in Cuba and the Soviet Union. According to Tom Merritt, Administrator of NBC's Sports Information, "There's no doubt Donna's worked very hard and deserves good grades as a sportscaster."

Donna became the only U.S. journalist permitted to visit the new East German Sports Center. She has visited Leningrad as a guest of the Soviet Union, and wrote of that country's swimming efforts for the coming Olympics.

A writer for several magazines including *Redbook* and *Seventeen*, Donna writes all her commentary for her TV appearances. In order to prepare for the 1980 Olympics coverage she constantly "reads, reads, reads."

Although having appeared on NBC's "Today" show several times, she did not know that Jane Pauley, Δ —Indiana, is a Kappa, and is eagerly awaiting her chance to surprise Jane with a

"Kappa handshake." Another Kappa at NBC is its president, Jane Cahill Pfeiffer, ΓΨ-Maryland.

Donna visits her family as often as she can—two brothers David and Kurt, sister Joanne, and parents Dave and Martha de Varona. One might guess that Donna's close family upbringing helped keep her feet on the ground throughout this exciting life she's led. Hopefully Kappa Kappa Gamma made a contribution also. Although an extremely busy person, Donna graciously made herself available to *The Key*.

Both in her swimming career and in broadcasting Donna has circumnavigated the globe. Of the time she donates to further the cause of sports, she says, "The world opened to me because I was an athlete. I'm proud to live in this country. It has the finest resources for the health of our young people."

Campus Sights and Sounds

EXAMS RAISE BLOOD PRESSURE and should be eliminated because they are hazardous to students' health, according to an Illinois researcher who has conducted a study at DePaul University before, during, and after exams. Apparently less pressure was felt by student who took an exam while music was being played as the rise was less among this group.

A CAMPUS FOOD PREFERENCE student recently showed fresh fruit, soup and salad rating higher than the All-American hamburger. Food service at Florida State University is offering ten food carts roaming the campus, one featuring fresh fruits and a blender for do-it-yourself liquid concoctions. Residence hall students may also call in an order and have it delivered.

RETAINING STUDENTS is another increasing problem facing administrators. After the superabundance of applicants during the past decade—which immediately filled vacancies left by drop-out, diminishing numbers of new students has made it increasingly important to retain those who want to leave after a year or two or who "want to take a year off."

ENTICING ALUMNI to return to the campus has advanced far beyond "Homecoming." Summer vacation/education packages which include the whole family are popular coast to coast, and the University of Colorado Alumni Association with the Boulder Hotel-Motel Association offers alumni a four-day ski package at reduced rates, using the slopes where "CU's champion NCAA ski team trains."

ALCOHOL USE AND ABUSE continues to be a major campus concern with up to 95 per cent using alcohol regularly, frequently to excess. There is no regional pattern; it is everywhere and is considered a significant student health problem.

FOREIGN STUDENT POPULATION in the United States has been increasing steadily since the end of World War II and currently comprises 2% of the student population. According to the *Chronicle of Higher Education*, the growing number in graduate programs is causing concern among educators because of curriculum adjustments made to accommodate foreigners' needs.

GIFT CERTIFICATES are available on many campuses for anything from books and supplies to tuition itself.

COMPUTER FRAUD has increased as the use of these mechanical wonders has grown. To aid businesses in stemming the tide of computer misuse the University of Toledo offered a three-day seminar on "How to Protect Your Organization from Computer Fraud, Embezzlement, and Costly Information Leaks."

COST OF PRIVATE COLLEGES has been a matter for much concern as it has continued to rise in recent years. At least one institution has reminded its alumni, however, that the cost of a year's education (tuition, housing, etc.) is a smaller percentage of the average parent income than it was in the 'forties.

AUXILIARY SERVICES is the term applied to all of those businesses which have become an integral part of most educational institutions—ranging down the alphabet from airports to word processing and including cookie stands, print shops, faculty clubs, etc. The profits shown by these operations through the years is showing a marked decrease, a fact which is causing still another worry as prices continue to escalate.

THE WRITING CRISIS is being met in different ways, and certainly "freshman English" has returned as a way of life. The University of Montana reported a summer spent teaching teachers to teach writing while others note a shift in departmental emphasis toward expository writing, writing labs to assist those students who "missed it" in junior high and high school, and more full-time faculty members teaching composition. The new Random House Handbook illustrates correct punctuation and grammar by using two campus characters, one a mystic and the other a revolutionary.

REFRIGERATORS have become a near-standard fixture in dorm rooms, so much so that Penn State is considering putting them in each room and raising room rates by \$10 rather than making them available for student rental as an option.

ROOMMATES MAY MAKE CONTRACTS which spell out such things as how furniture and appliances are shared, how expenses are paid, standards of living and conduct regarding smoking, household tasks, etc. The legally binding contracts for off-campus roommates are available through UCLA's residential life office.

Volunteers Are Called Greatest Resource

ST. LOUIS-The nation's greatest untapped resource capable of improving urban areas is citizen volunteers, more than 5,500 municipal leaders were told Monday.

The advice was delivered by George Gallup, the nationally recognized pollster who has been surveying attitudes and opinions for more than 40

Gallup addressed delegates to the National League of Cities convention who are discussing urban problems and solutions through Wednesday.

"Within recent days we have been conducting a nationwide survey for many individuals would be willing to serve in some capacity in their local communities," Gallup said.

He explained the survey was based on personal interviews with 4,000 residents of cities with populations 50,000 or more.

"The survey findings are impressive," he remarked. "Approximately seven of 10 adults living in urban America say they would be willing to serve on committees, to participate in neighborhood betterment activities, or to assist in the performance of local services."

Gallup added that these residents say they would be willing to volunteer an average of nine hours a month to these activities.

Projected to national scale, this means cities could obtain more than one billion man-hours per month from volunteers, Gallup said.

"The challenge to political leadership is to devise the machinery for making full and proper use of the talents of our citizens." he said.

Gallup admitted that many cities are taking advantage of volunteer power through the power of advisory committees, neighborhood organizations and review commissions.

However, cities should do a better job of showing their appreciation for those volunteer efforts by properly considering their recommendations and formally recognizing their accomplishments, he

Gallup said the survey revealed that citizens are most interested in lending a hand for school projects, senior citizen help, youth activities, housing for the poor and even cleaning up neighborhood litter.

"Out of this experience I have formed

a deep-seated conviction that citizens can perform miracles in their local communities no matter what the obstacles," Gallup stated.

Gallup suggested every city, large and small, take a yearly or biannual survey of its citizens to determine their opinions on municipal priorities and willingness to help meet those needs.

"Properly used, survey results can lead to better decisions . . . there is no better way to discover what a city can do to make living conditions more attractive, and to retain those citizens who are tempted to move out of the city," he said.

Citizen attitude surveys, followed up with efforts to recruit volunteers, will yield amazing results for civic betterment, Gallup predicted.

"Volunteerism offers convicing evidence to government and to the business community that citizens believe their community has a future-a future worth working for."


