# Preview of Convention Speakers

Kappa Convention June 15-21 at Tan-Tar-A, Lake of the Ozarks, Missouri, offers at least three terrific speakers. To whet your appetite, and convince you to come to convention, a sneak preview of the speakers' backgrounds is presented.

Speaking at the candlelight banquet will be **Martha Galleher Cox**, P<sup>A</sup>—Ohio Wesleyan. Marty has served Kappa in so many ways, beginning as a field secretary from 1943-46 and continuing to a high spot as toastmistress for the Centennial birthday dinner part at the 1970 convention.

Marty was the first director of chapters when that office evolved into a Council position in 1946, and in 1948, she became chairman of graduate counselors—a position she held until 1954.

As Fraternity ritualist for many years, Marty suggested the "installation version" of the initiation ceremony in 1962, and she presented to the 1968 convention an "Affirmation of Beliefs"—a credo for actives and pledges.

During her four years as director of philanthropies (1966-1970) Marty served on the Centennial Committee which jubilantly met its goal of \$500,000. She was elected once again as director of chapters in 1970 but did not complete that term of office.

In answer to an inquiry about how she now spends her time, Marty wrote; "It sounds pretty frivolous to say that traveling with Bud (both business and pleasure) and playing with grandchildren are my main activities. But lest one thinks all I do is play, please know that I'm still deep into all types of Church activity, including teaching a class of young marrieds—the next step after college ladies which I guess is a logical step for me. I'm very involved in working at a Neighborhood House in the Inner City, and am back on city Panhellenic, working toward the presidency in 1979."

Marty's talk is titled "Subtle Rays of Dawn" and is taken from the poem written

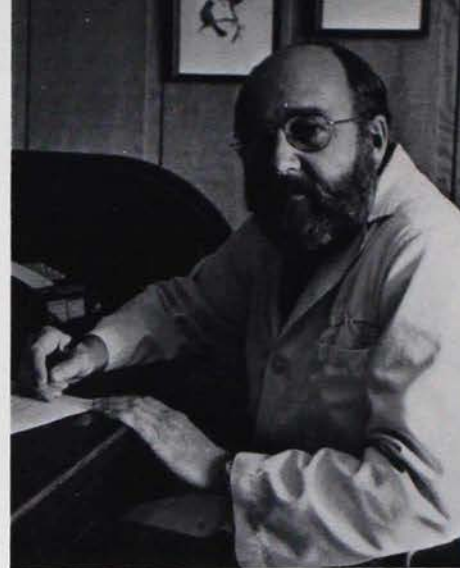

**Jayne Wade Anderson**, Alpha Xi Delta, is the guest speaker for the Panhellenic luncheon. She is the coordinator of sororities and fraternities at the University of Nebraska and has been the Acting Dean of Student Development. In addition to her university duties she has been serving as the elected president of Mortar Board, Inc. for the 1976-1979 triennium.

A popular guest speaker, Jayne has spoken to the National Panhellenic Conference, Alpha Chi Omega Convention, Alpha Xi Delta Convention, Kappa Delta Convention, and Panhellenic workshops in Massachusetts and at Drake University.

Jayne has been an English and Spanish teacher in high school, worked for United Airlines Passenger Center, and been affiliated with the University of Nebraska in various capacities since 1964. She has a daughter Laurie currently attending the University of Nebraska.

**Charles R. Peterson, M.D.** will be the guest speaker for the Sunday evening philanthropy dinner. Dr. Peterson is chairman, Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at the Howard A. Rusk Rehabilitation Center, University of Missouri in Columbia, Missouri. His background is filled with published works, chairmanships of many medical organizations, and literally pages of academic and hospital appointments.

Dr. Peterson received his undergraduate degree from Northwestern University in 1951 and received his doctor of medicine in 1955 from George Washington University. He served a rotating internship in Oakland, California, and returned to George Washington University Hospital with a fellowship in the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation from 1958 through 1961 when he was a special research fellow to the Royal Free Hospital, London, England, for a year.

Dr. Peterson's talk promises to show the audience the value of research, scholarship grants, and the effectiveness of volunteers. (P.S. his wife is a Kappa and advisor for Θ—Missouri).

# Kappa Colonizes at Dartmouth College (Epsilon Chi)

Kappa has colonized a chapter at Dartmouth College in Hanover, New Hampshire, in April and looks forward to a fall installation. Joining Sigma Kappa, the Kappas might be termed "pioneer women" on this formerly all-male campus.

John G. Kemeny\*, thirteenth president of Dartmouth College, gives a good picture of the campus and purpose of the college in his letter to prospective students:

"The fundamental purpose of Dartmouth College is to provide an undergraduate experience that will train young men and women to become leaders of our society.

While the existence of professional schools of medicine, business, and engineering, as well as a number of Ph.D. programs, provides opportunities usually found only in large universities, Dartmouth has always assigned highest priority to the quality of its undergraduate program. Undergraduate students outnumber graduate students and professional school students combined by a 5:1 ratio. This assures that the Faculty of Arts and Sciences devotes most of its attention to undergraduates.

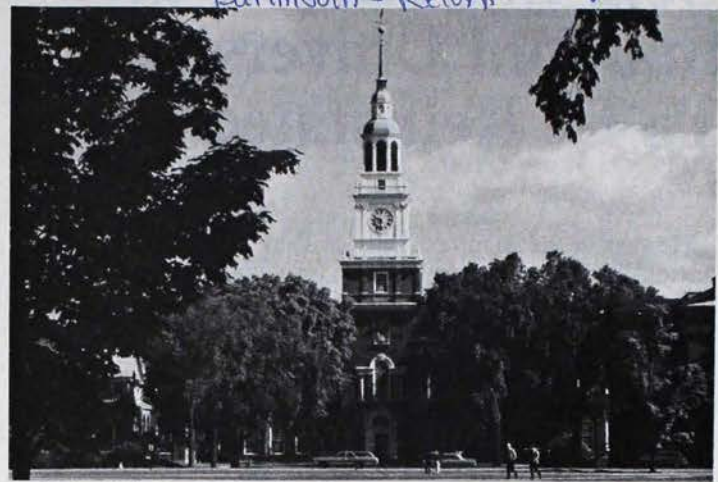
Dartmouth prides itself on the fact that freshmen courses are taught by the best members of the faculty. Special facilities, such as our million-volume library, a superb center for the creative arts, and the best educational computing facility in the country, are freely available to all students and have a pervasive influence on undergraduate education.

Because of the preponderance of undergraduates, opportunities usually limited to graduate students are available to all Dartmouth students. Undergraduates serve as teaching assistants or research assistants to senior faculty members. Our widely acclaimed computer system was designed mostly by undergraduates. Undergraduates serve on many departmental and institutional decision-making bodies and they take initiative in many projects whose impact is far beyond the Dartmouth campus. Above all, undergraduates feel part of a small, closely-knit community that provides a fellowship to be cherished for life.

Much has been said of the importance of "place." The college is located in a lovely town in northern New England, in an area of great natural beauty, removed from the pressures of urban or suburban life. It is an ideal location for the life of the mind, where the out-of-doors plays a major role in the shaping of individual personalities."

Dartmouth Row, the original site of Dartmouth College when it was founded more than 200 years ago, becomes a study in white in winter, as a pair of cross country skiers returning from a day on the trail pass in front of it.

Dartmouth was founded in 1769, when England's King George III gave approval to a charter prepared by the governor of the Province of New Hampshire, establishing an institution "for the education and instruction of Youth of the Indian Tribes in this Land in reading, writing, and all parts of Learning which shall appear necessary and expedient for civilizing and christianizing Children of Pagans as well as in all liberal Arts and Sciences and also of English Youth and any others."

The following year a single log hut was erected as the home of Dartmouth College and the first class of four students was graduated in 1771. Dartmouth Medical School, Thayer School of Engineering, and Tuck School of Business Administration were all established by the turn of the century. Dartmouth boasts many famous alumni—among them is Daniel Webster.

In 1971 the Board of Trustees decided to admit women—adding about 1000 students to make a total student body of 4000. They also initiated the Dartmouth Plan where a student spends at least one summer term studying at college and approximately 3/4 of the student body—and never more than 3200—are in residence at any one term. The undergraduate is challenged to define personal educational goals and has an opportunity to shape a formal educational program which best suits these goals.

For fun and recreation many students head for the Skiway in the winter, or strap on cross country skis to tour the campus. Plans are laid each year for the Dartmouth Winter Carnival with its snow sculpture, ski jumping and racing, plays, concerts, and parties on Fraternity Row. There are skating parties on Occum Pond and intramural hockey games to liven the days. Dartmouth women participate fully in existing academic pursuits most extracurricular activities of the College. A student group, Women-at-Dartmouth, has organized the Rabbit's Luck coffeehouse for weekend informal gatherings and is experimenting with development of a women's center and informal orientation programs for freshman women.

\*John Kemeny is a distinguished mathematician-philosopher, teacher, and pioneer in the development of computer time-sharing for educational purposes. He is a native of Budapest, Hungary and was graduated summa cum laude from Princeton and received a Ph.D. there in mathematics. During World War II, while still in his teens, he was assigned by the Army to serve as a mathematician on the Manhattan Project in Los Alamos, and later was a research assistant to Albert Einstein.



# Beta Eta Chapter at Stanford University To Be Reinstated

Nestled in the Stanford Hills of Palo Alto, California, is a beautiful university campus whose focal point is its magnificent Hoover Tower. Ever since the rains started turning these beautiful hills green and covering them with abundant blankets of bright orange California Poppies, purple Lupin, yellow Mustard, and white Clover, and the Stanford Board of Trustees voted to lift a thirty-three year ban on sororities, a new purpose and interest has sprouted among many of the women students. Now in full bloom—Sororities have returned to Leland Stanford University.

In 1944, the Beta Eta Chapter of Kappa Kappa Gamma was removed with seven other sororities from the Stanford campus by the University, leaving only men's fraternities to continue. Many months ago great enthusiasm started vibrating through the campus when there were rumors regarding the lifting of the ban on sororities. Local groups started forming around Active transfers and Legacies of NPC groups with the intent of organizing the return of the women's Greek system to Stanford, if in fact the ban was lifted, and then to petition their respective National Councils for reinstatement and/or chartering.

In December, 1977, the ban was lifted but that did not mean what we had hoped it would. The lifting of the ban did not mean that the University was inviting sororities back on campus—only that they would not stop the women students from forming and/or joining any outside interest groups. It would instead mean restrictions on housing, meeting rooms, and University recognition. Even with this atmosphere, these women were determined to have NPC sororities back at Stanford and join with the already existing men's fraternities for a full Greek system.

Last Spring, a Kappa transfer from Bucknell U., Lola Nashashibi, showed her interest in starting a group. There seemed to be great interest to join with Lola and organize what they all hoped would some day become a Kappa chapter. This group worked together in a small number which, by the time they were ready to petition, was increased to an interested

group of forty to forty-five women, with thirty-four signing the formal petition for the reinstatement of the Beta Eta Chapter.

These women met, at their request, with Jean Hess Wells (Fraternity President) and Pat Maness Kriz (Pi PDC) in early February, 1978, to discuss Kappa in full and to discover why this particular group of women was interested in Kappa. The subjects covered were finances, philanthropies, policies, standards, obligations and commitment, and their desire for a lasting tie to their college days. With all questions answered (both from Kappa and to Kappa) and the determination of these women, their petition to Kappa Council was in the mail within a week after this meeting.

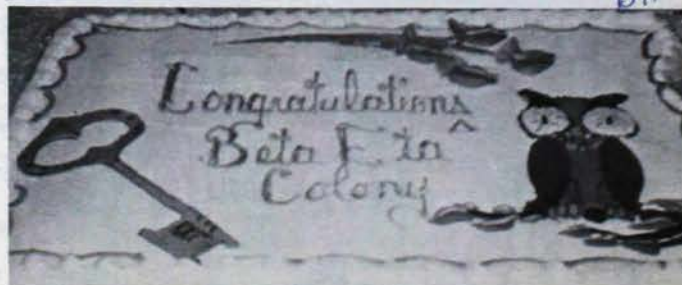
The petition was granted February 20th. On Tuesday, February 21st, after a pot-luck dinner in the home of Mrs. Duane L. Hillyard, there was a candle passing ceremony announcing the formal pinning of the blue and blue ribbons. Formal Colonization was held March 2, 1978, in the lovely home of Erna Gaede Kurtzon, Y, Northwestern, with twenty-nine outstanding women pledged. Among those attending were Margaret Helser VerMehr (Pi Province Magazine Chairman); Presidents of the Palo Alto, San Jose, and San Mateo Alumnae Associations—Janet Nelson Reimers, ΓM—Oregon State, Barbara Reith Collier, ΔX—San Jose State, and Louise Forve Barker, ΓΞ—UCLA, respectively; and the Colonizing team—Kay Smith Larson, Director of Chapters and Colonizing Officer, Patricia Maness Kriz, Pi PDC, Ann Fletcher Colvin, Pi PDA, and Patricia Ball Hillyard, Colonizing Chairman.

The Beta Eta Deuteron Colony presently consists of its twenty-nine pledges and two Active transfers—Lola Nashashibi, ΔΦ—Bucknell, who will be BH<sup>Δ</sup>'s Undergraduate Counselor, and Elizabeth Abel, EO—U. of California at Davis. As Spring Rush is fast approaching, BH<sup>Δ</sup> is sure to increase in size rapidly.

As there has been much time and energy spent in organizing the individual sororities (Alpha Phi, Kappa Alpha Theta, Pi Phi, and Kappa plus two local groups hoping to be Nationally recognized by Chi Omega and Kappa Delta) so has there been in organizing an Inter-Sorority Council complete with officers. Their main goal at present is to have a successful and compatible "Panhellenic" Spring Rush.

And so it seems that the women's Greek system has indeed found a fertile place to grow and be strong. Beta Eta has bloomed again and is already enjoying togetherness through Exchanges with fraternities, parties, dining together, philanthropic work, and a holiday for some in Hawaii. They are working well with a full Advisory Board and feel the women Greeks are here to stay—working hard toward a 'total' Greek System—opportunity for all—again at Stanford.

# Kappa Extends to Santa Barbara, California

The University of California Santa Barbara is one of nine campuses which make up the University of California, one of the world's great institutions of higher learning. The scenic coastal campus overlooks the Pacific Ocean close to Santa Barbara. Enrolling approximately 14,000 students, UCSB offers academic programs in 80 fields of study.

The mild climate, a setting of quiet beauty and many opportunities for attention to the individual student combine to make UCSB a stimulating, appealing center of advanced learning. A student may choose from 3,000 courses. UCSB strives to keep its classes small.

Campus scenes at the University of California at Santa Barbara only hint at the many recreational facilities: gymnasium sports, intramurals, swimming, tennis, horseback riding, and surfing on two-mile beach. There are 8 sororities, 8 fraternities, 10 honorary organizations, 6 service organizations, and Residence Halls Association.

The education abroad program is centered at Santa Barbara with more than 600 students going overseas to Brazil,

Santa Barbara, which has been associated with the University of California for more than 30 years, dates its origin back to 1891 when the Anna S. C. Blake Manual Training School was founded. Other antecedents were affiliated with the state college system. With the addition of the general liberal arts program, the school became Santa Barbara College of the University of California in 1944. In 1958, it was designated a general campus of the University.

The present 808-acre location has been "home" since 1954, when the campus was moved from a 14-acre site in Santa Barbara's Riviera section. A portion of the present campus was formerly a marine air station, and some temporary barracks buildings reminiscent of the World War II period may still be found among the 40 permanent buildings which have been constructed.

Central to the academic community is the University Library, the largest university library on the west coast between UCLA and Stanford. With more than one million volumes, it contains numerous distinguished special collections, including the Wyles Collection of Lincolniana and Western Americana. Construction has been completed on a four-story addition to the library's south wing.

Broadly based academic programs in almost all areas of learning, including a wide range of opportunities for interdisciplinary study, characterize this general campus of the University. Undergraduate majors are available in 90 subject areas, 40 programs lead to the Master's degree, and the Doctor of Philosophy is awarded in 28 fields.

The humanities, social sciences, and the natural and physical sciences are grouped into the largest academic unit, the College of Letters and Science, while the College of Creative Studies offers specialized instruction for undergraduate students who are selected on the basis of demonstrated talent in an art or a science. The campus has two professional schools—the College of Engineering and the Graduate School of Education—and a Graduate Division administers graduate affairs.

The Kappa colony was pledged in April, 1978 and plans are for a fall installation.

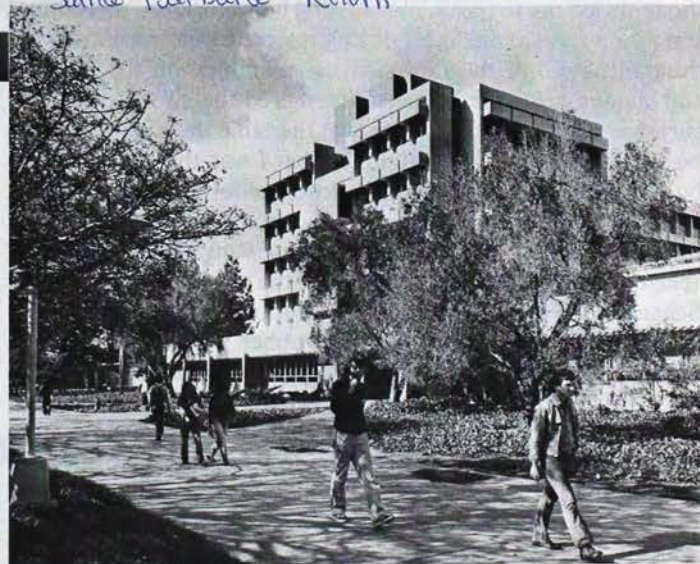

# CAREER REPORT:

## Yes You Can!

In 1976, after nearly 20 uninspired years of working in the medical profession, I was one of the fortunate people to become a part of Louisiana-Pacific Corporation in the capacity of Corporate Historian and Communications Coordinator. This opportunity resulted from some previous research I had completed for one of our officers and the fact that I grew up in the forest products industry. L-P is the colorful and exciting 5 year-old spinoff from Georgia-Pacific, and is an established leader in the industry. Besides researching and cataloging material for our ongoing history, I am privileged to interview key people, visit our plants and people in 14 states including Alaska, write in several capacities, take photos and conduct the marvelous "Achieving Your Potential" video tape seminars by Louis Tice, Chairman and Founder of Pacific Institute in Seattle, Washington, for our L-P people. More on this later.

Being headquartered in Portland, I decided to attend a scheduled Oregon State Alumni barbecue here in a downpour on August 29, only to find that I was the sole alumni member to show up! Only the cook-to-be, OSU President Robert MacVicar, was there. He rewarded my loyalty by having me as his guest in the president's box at the upcoming USC game, thus giving me a delightful return to the campus after many years. I made it a point to revisit our beautiful Kappa Kastle, and was thrilled indeed with its maintained beauty and dignity, as well as with the true Kappa warmth and courtesy extended me by my young active hostess. Memories flooded back as I looked into the room where I sat stunned at my first news of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, and remembered the subsequent departure for war of friends and relatives . . . and later, of photographs of suddenly-uniformed men on our dressers. In the living room, I pictured the stack of big band records which we played constantly for solace and enjoyment, never dreaming then that I would count among my dear friends those popular singers from the Glenn Miller orchestra, Tex Beneke, Ray Eberle and Paula Kelly and the Modernaires, as I have for the past several years . . . and more recently, Bob Eberly and Helen O'Connell, from the Jimmy Dorsey orchestra. Musical thoughts led me to recall, too, writing lyrics for our "sweetheart song" . . . and years later, during my return in the 1950s, the thoughtfulness of the then actives assembled on the stairway and singing it for me. I also remembered the sweetness of the surprise, hugs, singing and tears at the table the night the year-book editor came by to announce that I was the senior "year-book queen" . . . our affectionate housemother, Mrs. Leekley, our dear cook, "Auntie Pearl," houseboys, nickel hops, sock hops, formals, football games and our win at the Rose Bowl (played at Duke that year because of the war, cheating our Kay Seberg (Sears) out of her Queen's honors) . . . concerts, convos, wooden shoes worn because rubber was rationed, cramming for finals, the ever-busy laundry room, meaningful meetings, KKG firesides, fire drills, engagement announcements, honors earned by our girls, griefs shared . . . serenades from under the sleeping porch windows . . . singalongs at the table and around the piano, skits . . . good-natured pranks . . . and through it all the wonder and warmth of Kappa sisterhood, which I still feel today among old and new Kappa friends. a thrill to find 9 out of 12 of our Kappa seniors back 30 years later to Homecoming! Not only do I often encounter Kappas in my travels, giving me an immediate bond, but I also meet men who have sweet memories of Kappas at their schools! After working here for 6 months, I discovered another L-P Gamma Mu on the other side of my office wall, Nancy Colt Jenks, OSU '50 . . . so in Kappa it also is a small world.

Kappas being the dedicated, devoted and progressive women that they are would be rewarded by experiencing this Tice seminar. It is geared to anyone and everyone, with remarkable success having been demonstrated at all ages and in countless fields, including business, finance, education, sales, administration, minorities, corrections, athletics . . . and more.

What he does is to teach us WHY we are WHAT we are . . . and why we MUST act as we believe ourselves to be. He quotes Henry Ford: "Whether you think you can or think you can't, you're right." In his unique dynamic, humorous, understandable way, he provides his audiences with a mental "tool kit" with which to "get out of our own way" so we may make our minds work to achieve and to continue achieving our goals. He teaches how to goal-set without stopping short . . . and how to gain happiness and success in all facets of life.

This course seems to be an extension of L-P's nation-wide "Yes We Can!" program, instituted by our company during the worldwide down times of 1975, emphasizing the importance of the individual in remedying the situation whether at home or elsewhere. Over 100 corporations adopted our slogan; it even appeared on Kellogg's cereal boxes, and President Ford joined us in wearing a "Yes We Can!" button. 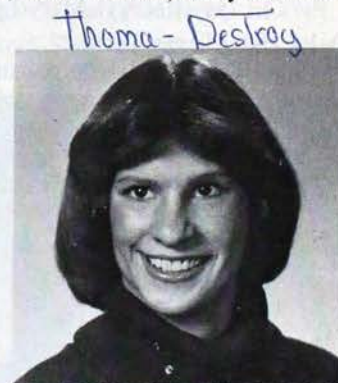

## Campus Sights & Sounds

**ECHOES ON ENGLISH:** While we complain of the inability of students to handle the English language as well as they once did, listen to these echoes from the past offered by Josephine Speark, associate professor of Education at Indiana University. 1890: "In the complaints drawn up by colleges against high schools, it is the inability to write passably correct English that is most severely complained of." 1910: "It is the common complaint among businessmen that young people seeking employment are not well grounded in the fundamentals." 1917: "From every college in the country goes up the cry, 'Our freshmen can't spell, can't punctuate!'" 1965: "The English language is dying because it is not being taught."

**TAPE TYCOONS** are appearing on campus—enterprising persons who pay as many as 100 students to take usable notes or tape class lectures which are reproduced for sale. On one campus lecture notes sell for \$18 a semester, verbatim notes, \$40, and notes plus tapes, \$125.

**QUALITY EDUCATION** is the emphasis of a campaign launched by the University of Colorado student government, pointing also to the need for research support funds and efforts to keep tuition costs down. Fact sheets have been circulated among students and appear on bulletin boards urging readers to write legislators expressing their desire for quality over quantity on the Boulder campus.

**FOOD CONSERVATION** is receiving the attention of the Coca Cola Company which has selected five schools (Yale, Stanford, Michigan State, South Carolina, Indiana) to compete to see which can waste the least food. An Indiana official comments that in serving 50,000 meals each day, an ounce of food left on a plate adds up to 1.5 tons of waste a day, nearly 8 tons a week.

**PART-TIME STUDENTS** are still a large percentage of the educational population, especially at the graduate level. Total enrollment in graduate programs has remained steady though the number of applications for graduate school has decreased slightly, according to the Council of Graduate Schools.

**VITICULTURE AND ENOLOGY** are being studied by more than 150,000 students on 600 campuses—the study of grape cultivation and the study of wine respectively.

**RENT-A-TEACHER** is what they're calling the increase in part-time faculty, according to the *Chronicle of Higher Education*. In four years, it states, the number of full-time faculty members on the nation's campuses has increased 4% while the number of part-time professors has leaped up by 38%.

**MORE STATISTICS** from the National Center for Education Statistics tell us that the percentage of students studying within their home states continues to increase, about 85% at the present time.

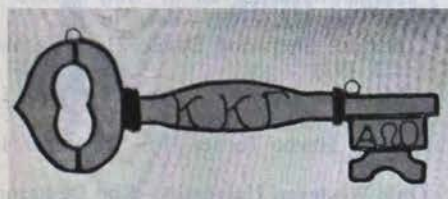
**INFORMATION** of any sort may be had at Bowling Green State University by calling Campus Fact Line which averages more than 60,000 inquiry calls each academic quarter. One of the most successful of such services, the Bowling Green operation has served as a model for similar systems elsewhere. Operators are on duty from 10 a.m. til midnight, Monday through Friday, and noon til midnight over the weekend. Campus Fact Line has been in operation since 1971. Similar but newer, the information service at the University of Wisconsin says it is now averaging about 500 calls each week.

**STUDENT VOLUNTEER** Bureau at Drake needed more volunteers and placed notices about itself with each candy bar in campus vending machines. Results: students inquiring about volunteer work have increased 15%.

**EXERCISE** has gained more than time and attention as at least nine campuses have created Paracourses, "innovative exercise trails that let users gain physical fitness in the outdoors while working at their own pace," according to *National On Campus Report*. A San Francisco firm, Paracourse, Ltd., provides plans, signs, and fittings (cost \$2,000 for the 18-station course which features different exercise routines at each stop. These range from jumping jacks to chin-ups and includes walking a balance beam. The tour combines walking and jogging as its recommended travel between stations.

**AFTER GRADUATION**—then what? This may be the question for which this decade will be remembered as students focus program choices and even electives toward certainty of employment after graduation. Educational institutions are noticeably revved up in areas which can furnish the answer. Many are using their own alumni as counselors in specific fields or with specific corporations. Catholic University has a well-stocked "career cart" where students may browse and talk with the professional manning the cart which next year will be handled by students. Texas Christian University's director of career development describes the change of outlook in the past five years as "from strictly placement office matching student with job, to the concept of career planning . . . Right now, prospective employers seem to be looking for two types of people. One is the new graduate they can train. The other is the alumna who's been out for two or three years and is dissatisfied with what he's doing. Georgia Tech reached down to the high school level and offered 44 students a seven-week program which offered a preview of careers in engineering and science.

# Myrtle Oliver Roever: A Gift To Kappa

MYRTLE OLIVER ROEVER,  $\Gamma I$ —Washington University, is described by former Fraternity President Lou Barbeck as "one of the finest, kindest, most considerate ladies I've known—the epitome of being refined and intelligent."

Besides serving six years as Rose McGill chairman, major Kappa positions entrusted to Myrtle have been: Theta province director of alumnae; first Texas state reference chairman; assistant to Lou Barbeck when she was director of chapters and director of membership; Gamma Phi Chapter council advisor; and president-elect of both Houston and Dallas Alumnae Associations.

Myrtle confided: "Before I went through Rush, I didn't know anything about sororities!" Somewhere between pinning the Key on blue-and-blue organdy and the presentation of her 50-year Pin in 1976, she has learned a great deal about Kappa.

This gracious, gentle, and compassionate lady is a sister whose devotion to Kappa is truly "national." She has been a busy member of alumnae associations in seven different cities. Myrtle says, "The best thing about Kappa is all the new friends you have in every city. I don't know how I would have gotten through all our moving without Kappas."

Gamma Iota is an unhouse chapter, so rush parties were held in homes of Kappa alumnae. She remembers fraternity parties and formals at country clubs. Myrtle met many dates through the sorority, and she met her husband, William A. Roever, a Tau Kappa Epsilon, through a Kappa sister in her sophomore year.

Myrtle and Bill were married in 1931, the day the St. Louis Cardinals won the World Series. In fact, before the wedding, all the men had gone off to the baseball game and didn't get back until after six o'clock! All her bridesmaids were Kappas.

The new Mr. and Mrs. Roever moved to their first home in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and Myrtle joined the Kappa alumnae association. 1932 found her moving to Houston, and subsequently to Wichita Falls, Texas, where the first of her two sons was born: Richard Oliver—after her father.

Oklahoma City Kappas claimed her membership in 1936, and Dallas for the next two years, where Bill, Jr. was born. Houston welcomed her the second time in 1938, and it was there Myrtle met her dear Kappa friend Doris Kirkham Brokaw,  $B\Xi$ —Texas.

She returned with the children to St. Louis during the World War II years to live with her parents while her husband was fighting in Europe. After the Roever family returned to Houston where she was a house chairman for Kappas' Christmas Pilgrimage Tour of Homes in 1948 under Jane Bothwell Waddill,  $B\Xi$ —Texas, she was Pilgrimage chairman herself twice. Her own home was shown on a later Pilgrimage.

In 1953 Myrtle was elected president of the Houston Alumnae Association, but had to resign after being elected Theta province director of alumnae at the convention in Tulsa. Epsilon Alpha Chapter at Texas Christian University was installed during her four years at PDA.

Myrtle's first Kappa Convention, of the eight she has attended, was in Jasper, Canada, where the Kappa train was welcomed by the Mounted Police. At special training sessions for province directors she said, "I found out how little I really know about being a PDA." Myrtle was given an allowance and told to travel around the entire Theta Province, which then consisted of Texas, Arkansas, and Oklahoma, to visit every alumnae club. Her husband took his vacation and drove with her all over Arkansas.

Myrtle was so impressed with Kappa alumnae in her four years as PDA that she gave a silver tea service to be awarded at Province Meetings to the alumnae group which shows the most overall improvement in memberships, projects, and general Kappa spirit.

In 1957, director of chapters Eleanor Goodrich "Goodie" Campbell called to ask Myrtle to organize the state of Texas into reference areas. She was able to accept the job in 1959, and asked, "What do I do?" Goodie answered, "You'll know what to do!"

In Dallas she loved being Gamma Phi Chapter council advisor. Elected president of the Dallas Alumnae Association in 1965, Myrtle was terribly disappointed when a move to Houston prevented her from serving her term.

Myrtle has many interests; investment clubs, Shakespeare Society, book clubs, philanthropy for the blind, symphony drives, hospital board, and church work. Her interest in the Rose McGill Fund began with a terminally-ill Dallas Kappa named Hazel, who was a recipient of the Fund for two years. Myrtle and several other Kappas looked after her until her death.

Martha Galleher Cox,  $P\Delta$ —Ohio Wesleyan, director of philanthropies, asked Myrtle to become the Rose McGill chairman in 1969.

Traditionally the Fund has covered three areas of service; sustaining aid to members in financial need, emergency aid for sudden crisis, and scholarship aid for alumnae. The third of these areas is now administered under a separate program known as Circle Key Grants.

The most difficult thing to know when Myrtle took office was how much to budget. "The Fund had grown so much that we needed a more firm financial basis to work from," she explained. Doris Brokaw became Myrtle's assistant and the two of them set up the books for the Fund. She continued, "I couldn't have gotten along without Doris."

"A Rose McGill chairman has to be a special person," explained Doris Brokaw, "and Myrtle has the great humility and gentleness needed for the job." According to Lou Barbeck, "Myrtle always hated public speaking, but being Rose McGill Chairman was her forte."

Myrtle's own view of the job follows:

*"I have received more enjoyment than anything I have done in my life. I felt as if doing brought peace of mind and joy into the hearts of the Rose McGill family. I will never forget these women. It was such a great joy to see them go back on their own from every bad circumstance imaginable. I think of the funds as 'A GIFT OF LOVE FROM THEIR SISTERS'."*

The candle has now been passed to Betty Volk, who became the sixth Rose McGill Chairman when Myrtle retired in 1976, and in Myrtle's words is "just the right person for the job."

Whether dressed in blue-and-blue organdy or wearing the robes of a Fraternity Chairman, Myrtle Oliver Roever is a gift to Kappa.

# In Search of an Author?

In 1971 a copy of a poem written by an active at Beta Delta Chapter was received by the Fraternity Council and was used at province meetings that year. Through the years it gained in popularity and a search began to establish authorship.

This search led through files and from one source to another until finally Mrs. Kelly, who was the house director at the Beta Delta house and is now in this capacity at the Epsilon Gamma house at the University of North Carolina, suggested the name of Kim Kendall. A letter went to her asking, "Are you the author of the poem, and can you recall under what circumstances or for occasion the poem was written?"

A marvelous response follows from Kim Kendall Kircher, BA—Michigan.

"The University of Michigan in 1970 was a frazzled, volatile place. It reflected the enormous political and social upheavals swarming across the country at that time. Similarly, the (Beta Delta) Kappa house was undergoing staggering changes. Its basic premises, and the methods by which it was executed, were being challenged.

It became evident to the Rush Committee, as it had been to me for many years, that the Final Desserts ceremony however moving for the members, was pathetically meaningless to rushees whose minds were clutched and bewildered by turmoils of major proportions. The ceremony spoke in antiquated language of an obscure idea to highly critical and increasingly cynical freshmen. Their social and academic life was charged by the ravages of Vietnam, Kent State, Dow Chemical, and Richard Nixon. In such an atmosphere, allegories of a fleur-de-lis are limp and senseless.

It was, therefore, the collective opinion of those programming the ceremony that a significant update was necessary. I was approached to write 'something relevant,' which I would read as the final portion of the new program. Nothing from the old ceremony remained; whether or not that is still true, I don't know. I am told, however, that my poem is still used.

Creatively, it was an easy poem to write, for it was essentially an extension of my own experiences in college, at the Kappa house in particular. It was also a manifestation of my belief that a sorority is not an abstract idea or formal ritual, but rather the collective experience of living with and understanding 60 girls. No eloquent or flowery conclusions applied; at best, it is a tentative statement on a subjective experience. I tried to make the poem sound human, to soften some of the rigid language that I felt intimidated or offended those who are considering membership. The traditional Final Desserts ceremony certainly served its purpose. But it was as appropriate and credible in 1970 as DeSotos. Its time had come, and gone.

The poem was presented for spring rush 1970. In April 1971 I moved to New Mexico, and thereafter gave little thought to the poem's fate, assuming that it would be passed down, sadly, as 'anonymous'.

Therefore, you can understand my delight in receiving your letter. I neither expect, nor would accept, any sort of remuneration for

writing it. But I do insist that further copies and presentations include my name as its author.

Upon reflection, I am sure I would alter parts of the poem. Times have changed, I have changed. But I think that its basic message explains what Kappa is, as I saw it eight years ago, as I see it now. That it is meaningful today, as it was then, seems to suggest the durability of its truths."

- The name of the rushee
- Address, state, and zip code
- High School attended and its location
- Exact high school grades and the system on which it is based. (ACT and SAT scores are excellent if known.)
- Personal details about the rushee which make her come alive.
- Special interests, talents, specific experiences which have been important in formulating the rushee's personality.
- Activities in school, church, and community.
- Your signature and the date and year submitted.
- The countersignature of the alumnae reference chairmen if required.
- A PICTURE of the rushee is so helpful. News clippings also are effective.

Dear Kappas:

The anticipation of rush. . . the excitement of pledge-ship. . . the involvement of active membership. . . the deepening loyalties of alumnae—these are the "seasons" of Kappa. We go through rush, we pledge; we participate as actives; we become alumnae. Kappa membership is for life.

Spring is the season of renewal, a harbinger of things to come. Each Spring Kappa alumnae seek out those young women from their communities who they wish to point out to our chapters. They contact their area reference chairmen; they submit information; they write references.

Nowhere is the continuity of our fraternity more clearly seen than in the process of membership selection. This fragile cooperative effort of actives and alumnae insures the future of Kappa by providing our chapters with information on young women who will attend college on campuses where there are Kappa chapters. It is the privilege of alumnae to recommend to membership; it is the responsibility of active members to select.

What are the qualities our chapters look for in potential members. Let's consider some of the basics. Undergraduates first and foremost want new members who are fun to be with; we call it congeniality. Our chapters look for members who are willing to make a commitment of time and talent to the group; dead wood is not needed. Chapters today feel that it is very important that new members have exhibited some

measure of scholastic success in high school; college work is increasingly difficult and all students must measure up. Finally chapters look for those young women who have the potential for individual achievement in whatever their chosen field.

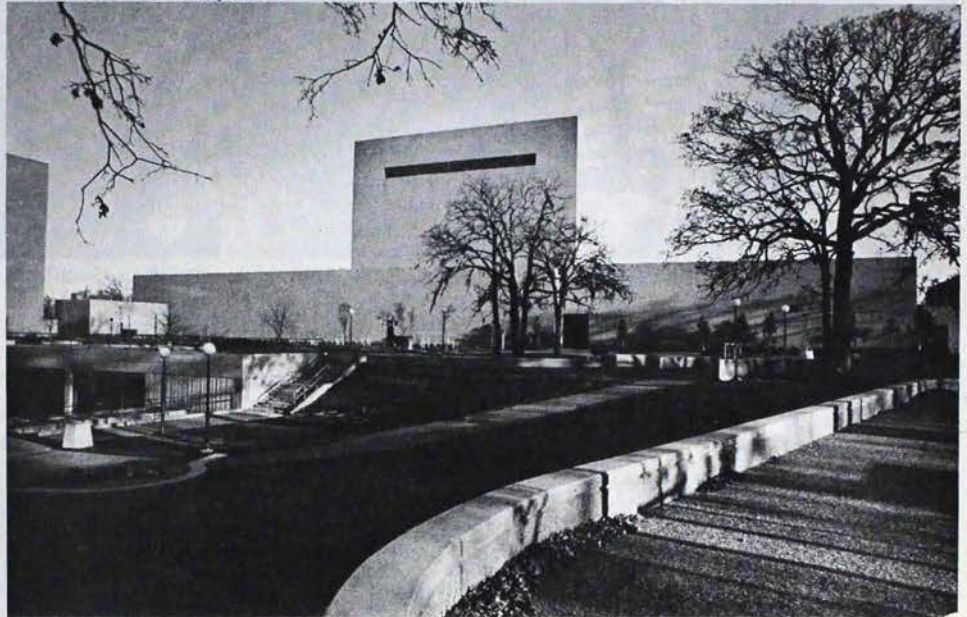

## Lyndall Finley Wortham Honored by the University of Houston

Among the words of greeting at the official dedication on February 3, 1978 of the new theatre at the University of Houston named for Lyndall Finley Wortham, BΣ—Texas, were these by Aaron J. Farfel, Chairman of the Board of Regents: "It is especially fitting that the theatre we dedicate tonight bears the name of a distinguished Houstonian who has served the university with distinction since her appointment to the Board of Regents in 1963."

Built at a cost of \$5.5 million, the 76,000 square foot structure contains a computer memory system, the first of its kind and the most sophisticated lighting control system in the world. Superlatives must be used to describe all aspects of the theatre, from the plush decor to the extensive equipment and the dramatic architecture. The latter includes a glassfront lobby overlooking a plaza and a sloping wedge-shaped glass roof that soars skyward 105 feet.

University President Philip G. Hoffman presided over the dedication program which included greetings from the Houston theatre community and congratulations from Vincent Price, Viveca Lindfors, Eli Wallach, John Houseman, Samuel Bronston and Joan Mondale, wife of the United States Vice President. In the black-tie audience were Texas Lieutenant Governor and Mrs. Bill Hobby. Several speakers praised Mrs. Wortham for her dedicated service, civic contributions and gracious personal

qualities. Touched by their remarks, she responded, "When the heart is so full, the lips find words difficult."

The dedication program continued with a performance by the Royal Shakespeare Company of London, followed by a reception for the capacity audience and honored guests.

Three separate governors of Texas have appointed Lyndall Wortham to consecutive six-year terms as a member of the Board of Regents. She is currently serving as secretary of the board. Long interested in philanthropic endeavors, Mrs. Wortham and her late husband, Gus S. Wortham, established the Wortham Foundation in 1958. The Foundation has made substantial contributions to medical, cultural and educational programs and projects.

Mrs. Wortham is president of Girlstown U.S.A. in Whiteface, Texas, a home for girls whose own homes have been disrupted. She has also been active with the Houston Speech and Hearing Center, the American Cancer Society, the Garden Club of Houston, the Houston Symphony Society, the Houston Grand Opera Association, Theatre Under the Stars, the Houston Ballet, Beta Sigma Phi and is a generous and loyal sister of Kappa Kappa Gamma.

In the words of University of Houston Chancellor Barry Munitz, "The Lyndall Finley Wortham Theatre is indeed a very fitting tribute to the extraordinary woman for whom it is named."

**Gretchen Kiger Cryer**, 1—DePauw, is a playwright, actress, singer and composer whose varied talents are gaining national recognition. She and a good friend, Nancy Ford, began writing shows together in college and their collaboration has grown ever since. They have written several off-Broadway shows, including "Last Sweet Days of Isaac," which won the 1970 Obie (off-Broadway equivalent of the Tony). They have appeared at New York's Town Hall, on the Dinah Shore Show and at the Women's Conference in Houston. Kappas are ingenious, a fact that alumnae and actives continue to prove. As they find new ways to share their interests and activities, active-alumnae interaction continues to broaden in scope.

The **Portland Alumnae Association** has appointed an AAI Chairman and her first year's program with **BQ—Oregon** and **ΓM—Oregon State** includes several novel ideas. Seniors will receive an invitation to accept an alumnae bid. An initiation gift idea that is currently being checked out is terrycloth towels which will be stamped, "I'm all wrapped up in you, KKG."

At **EΛ—Tennessee**, a reversal of roles was enjoyed when **Knoxville** alumnae put on a skit for the chapter. Kappa history portrayed seriously and in fun and special desserts brought by the alumnae provided enjoyment, but real interaction occurred when everyone helped to clean up! The same idea occurred to **Champaign-Urbana** alumnae and nine of their members entertained **BA—Illinois**. Kappas must be hams at heart!

All Kappas have a special feeling for 50 year members. The **Madison Alumnae Association** decided that these ladies should have a special visit if they were unable to attend Founders' Day. The alumnae brought a flower and news of the active chapter and alumnae group. When the philanthropy chairman of **H—Wisconsin** asked if they could help, it was decided that each visit would be made by an alumnae, an active and a pledge, as a group. Despite scheduling problems, the program is working well and growing. The 50 year Kappas enjoy reminiscing about their chapter days and incidentally provide unusual bits of FE. The actives and pledges, in turn, enjoy a greater insight into the many years of Kappa participation still ahead of them. In addition, this is a program where small numbers make for great satisfaction and pride.

Many have found that AAI is bound to be a success when food is involved and a variation on this theme is the highly successful philanthropy project that **Pasadena** alumnae helped kick off for **ΔT—U.S.C.** The Junior

League of Pasadena wrote *The California Heritage Cookbook*, which provides a colorful history of the state plus creative dishes reflecting the "melting pot" of cultures within its boundaries. Alumnae members arranged for the chapter to sell copies of the cookbook and receive a portion of the price. Early sales netted about \$400 for the chapter.

Close feelings have been achieved by the **Bryan-College Station Alumnae Club** and **EP—Texas A & M**. Besides helping with the establishment of the chapter, the alumnae have provided support in many ways. One alumna helped organize the pickers. A back-to-school picnic for actives and alumnae was a delightful dress rehearsal for them and will probably become a tradition. Founders' Day had the actives presenting a skit and conducting the candle ceremony while alumnae remembered when there were not enough Kappas in the area to hold the candles! Plans are under way now for hobby groups and the "opportunity to enjoy Kappa friendships across several generations through sharing interests or talents."

This innovative group has two special ideas that others might like to try. The alumnae make mason jar owl banks to give to the pledges along with the slogan "A dime a day keeps your key on the way." Also, in order to solve the enormous communication problem of scattered alumnae contacting unhoused chapter members, the pledge trainer prepares typed lists of all chapter actives and pledges names and addresses, plus chapter calendars. The alumnae reciprocate with copies of their directory and contact can be made quickly and personally.

Sometimes alumnae aid to an active chapter can include more than one alumnae group. Under the helm of the **Missoula Alumnae Association**, alumnae groups throughout the state provided material aid for **BΦ—Montana** and gave them the even greater intangible gift of a morale boost. Members of the active chapter realized that alumnae state-wide cared about them and wanted to help. **Billings**, **Butte** and **Helena** contributed a total of \$325 toward new library furniture for the chapter house; **Great Falls** has pledged the registration fee for another active to attend convention; other alumnae groups expect to contribute substantially again toward convention expenses for another chapter member. (Is this what having the convention chairman as a state resident does for your AAI enthusiasm?!!) Montana really pitches in for **BΦ**.

Finishing college and becoming an alumnae is a hazy thought for most actives. **Ann Arbor Association** sponsored a panel discussion entitled "Is There Life After College?" including actives from **BΔ—Michigan**, a career program exploring alternatives and choices to be made upon graduation.

Age, location, weather and distance make little difference. When Kappas get together, great things happen.
