

# An Introduction to the Heritage Museum

These words, printed on the cover of the Heritage Museum brochure, sum up the reasons for the establishment of the Kappa Kappa Gamma Heritage Museum. This exciting project was affirmed by vote of the 1980 General Convention. Incorporation and Internal Revenue Service approval of tax exempt status for the Museum took place that same year. A 15-member Board of Trustees, chaired by past Fraternity president Jean Hess Wells,  $\Delta Y$  — Georgia, will supervise the management of the Museum in cooperation with the Headquarters operation. The Articles of Incorporation provide for an Executive Board composed of the Fraternity president, vice president, treasurer, executive secretary, historian, and one other member selected biennially from among its membership by the Board of Trustees.

The current Executive Board consists of, in addition to Jean Wells, Sally Moore Nitschke, BN — Ohio State, Gay Chuba Barry,  $\Delta A$  — Penn State; Jean Schmidt,  $\Delta \Lambda$  — Miami U.; Betty Sanor Cameron, BN — Ohio State; Catherine Schroeder Graf, BN — Ohio State; and Katherine Morton Epler,  $\Gamma\Omega$  — Denison.

Ruth Bullock Chastang, BN — Ohio State; Sally Iredel Gulick,  $\Lambda$  — Akron; Katharine Bailey Hoyt, BN — Ohio State; Ruth Branning Molloy, BA — Pennsylvania; Katharine Wade Pennell, BN — Ohio State; Myrtle Oliver Roever,  $\Gamma I$  — Washington U.; Margaret Easton Seney,  $P^{\Delta}$  — Ohio Wesleyan; and Susan Burrows Swan, BN — Ohio State; also are serving on the Board of Trustees. The board is scheduled to meet biennially at the time of general conventions.

Kappa Kappa Gamma has owned the building at 530 East Town Street for 30 years. It was acquired in 1951 through the foresight of Clara O. Pierce, BN — Ohio State, the Fraternity's executive secretary from 1929 to 1969, at a time the area was in blight. With its purchase, Kappa became the first women's fraternity to establish a permanent headquarters.

The Town/Franklin neighborhood was one of Columbus' newest and most fashionable residential areas in 1852 when Philip Snowden, a wealthy dealer in silks and embroideries, built the mansion that was to become Kappa Headquarters nearly a century later. George Bellows, father of artist George Wesley Bellows, was the architect who designed the structure in the Renaissance Italian Villa Style. It is reputed to be the finest example of its kind in the city. Details include carved arched lintels, an iron entrance canopy and balcony cast in Philadelphia, and a

belvedere (small room on the top floor) crowned with a decorative finial. A wrought iron fence ornamented with a fleur-de-lis motifigraces the front of the property.

The lovely home remained a private residence for over 70 years. Governor and Mrs. David Tod and their seven children lived there during the early years of the Civil War. Several generations of the David S. Gray family resided in the house from 1869 until 1922.

The Columbus Women's Club bought the property in 1923 and remodeled it, adding an auditorium and adapting the interior to its needs. After the Depression, the building passed again into private hands, housing a succession of businesses and occupants. It had deteriorated into a poorly kept rooming house by the time Kappa became interested in it.

The Victorian mansion was 20 years old when KK $\Gamma$  was founded in 1870. Under the guidance of Clara Pierce and Fraternity architect Frances Sutton Schmitz,  $B\Delta$  — Michigan, the structure was restored to the elegance of that period. Careful planning resulted in the renovation of the stately drawing room on the first floor and the conversion of the remaining space into offices, work and storage areas, a lunch room, and a small kitchen. The remaining rooms on the second and third floors were retained as sitting and sleeping rooms for visiting Fraternity personnel. Two rental apartments were included to help subsidize the cost of operation. There also was an apartment for a hostess-manager, but in the ensuing years it, too, had to be used for Kappas attending meetings.

In 1965 a devastating fire destroyed the portion of the building cated between the original structure and the carriage house. arted into additional bedrooms and the indispensable second floor onference room.

Kappas can feel justifiable pride in this venerable residence which trees as a passageway into the Victorian Era and the period of our punding. Its significance was recognized by the Columbus Conventor and Visitors Bureau and its affiliate, the Helmsman, when they resented their first City Beautiful Award to the Fraternity in 1973. The own/Franklin neighborhood received listing in the National Register Historic Places in 1975 and is being revitalized by other organizations, businesses and individuals engaged in restoring properties in the

In addition to the period furniture that has been mentioned, many aluable items of silver, china, and jewelry can be seen throughout the buse. The Fraternity also has accumulated an enviable collection of istoric clothing. A sampling of these things usually is taken to biennial anyentions.

The establishment and funding of the Heritage Museum will provide roper display and storage facilities for the things we have. At the present time memorabilia is scattered throughout the house in an uncoordinated manner. Gowns and accessories are crowded, along with Fraternity regalia, into one inadequate closet. Security needs to be improved, as well.

The Museum will occupy the original portion of the building. This consists of the drawing room, the parlour across the hall, and the dining room which has been used as the executive secretary's office these many years. In addition, space will be dedicated to museum displays in the rooms above this part of the house. Up till now the drawing room has been the only first floor room available for period furnishings and exhibits. With the removal of the desks and office equipment now occupying the parlour and dining room, these areas can be utilized for Museum purposes. However, they also will have to be furnished in an authentic manner.


An architectural firm is coordinating the return of the oldest rooms of the dwelling to a residential character and the remodeling of the rest of the building for the administrative work of the Fraternity. New offices will appear in space that previously was wasted. Effective provision for resources, machine operation, and storage is planned.

Executive Secretary Betty Cameron has moved from her former office to a lovely room that was not a part of the house when it was built in 1852. Remodeling of the finance offices has been completed, but funding is needed in order that all of the projected modifications can be made.

It is hoped that the Heritage Museum will not only be the recipient of monetary contributions, but of other kinds as well. It is our good fortune to have many historic items in our collection, but it is far from

Convention souvenirs and scrapbooks (One scrapbook that has been given to the Museum contains a map unlike any in our archives, since many valuable records were destroyed in the 1965 fire.)

The Museum acquisition policy states that all contributions become the property of the Fraternity irrevocably and are subject to no restrictions of any kind. Appraisal costs are to be assumed by donors. Acknowledgement forms will be sent to donors by Museum personnel. The advice of consultants who have expertise in Victoriana and historic preservation also will be needed. Please let us know if you can help.

Many have volunteered to do research, help maintain our historic gowns, catalog our collection, assist with acquisition and funding, and just plain "help wherever needed."

Our short range goals for the Heritage Museum are to have a display of the life and times of KKF 100 years ago ready for Associate Council Seminar in June of this year and to have formal displays set up throughout our official "house" for the 1982 Convention in Columbus in June. 1982. All those who attend will see the Museum in full operation!

Our long range goals are:

(1) To relate our collection to the development of Kappa Kappa Gamma, which has been influenced by historic events in the United States and throughout the world

(2) To relate Kappa history to the education and social development of women, remembering that just over a century ago our educational opportunities consisted of little beyond grammar school

(3) To place major emphasis on American colleges and universities and the impact the Greek fraternity system and other education related organizations have had upon them

(4) To share responsibly our historic building, which is located in an important area of Columbus, with the people of the community and visitors from other communities throughout the world who attend Fraternity meetings, conventions in Columbus, and educational institutions in our vicinity




# Curator Attends Museum Workshop

Nancy Sanor Pennell, BN - Ohio State, curator of the Heritage Museum, was selected to attend a Midwest regional workshop on "Interpreting the Humanities through Museum Exhibits". It was held at the State Historical Society of Wisconsin in Madison, Wisconsin, March 8-11. The American Association for State & Local History, a national organization dedicated to advancing appreciation and knowledge of local history in the U.S. and Canada, sponsored the workshop with support from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Nancy joined 25 other historical agency professionals from Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Wisconsin at the workshop. All were selected on the basis of their involvement in exhibit work and ability to pass workshop-gained skills on to others.

Participants learned how to interpret history through artifacts, documents, and pictorial sources, how to write effective exhibit labels, how to design exhibits for special audiences, and how to plan and build economical exhibits. Shortly after her return to Fraternity Headquarters, Nancy will demonstrate her newly gained skills by preparing an exhibit that will be reviewed by Arminta Neal, nationally recognized exhibit design expert.

I was so surprised to pick up my winter issue of *The Key* and find MY MOTHER listed in the "Lost but not forgotten" section. I have enclosed the appropriate information on her for your records.

For a little history (and Polly Beall and I always thought this would be a great *Key* story!) My mom, Claire Weller Davis, attended Carnegie Tech in Pittsburgh and graduated in 1935. Dear Members of Kappa Kappa Gamma Fraternity:

As one of the recipients of the Kappa Kappa Gamma Graduate Fellowship for 1980, I am pleased to send a report of the progress that I have made toward my desired goal of becoming a dentist.

My first quarter could be described as interesting, rigorous, and challenging in many different ways. Perhaps the area I was least prepared for and yet enjoy tremendously, was the artistic aspect of dentistry. It has been MANY years since I have taken any art classes, and this past quarter we were required to draw and carve teeth, and use other dental materials in artistic ways. I felt that this was a pleasant break from the academic aspect of our curriculum.

My classes included Histology — learning about the different cells, tissues and organs in the body; Systemic Anatomy — largely taught through the dissection of human cadavers which was absolutely fascinating; Physiology — unfortunately, the LEAST favorite of my classes!; Dental Anatomy — a self paced course to teach the morphology of tooth structure; and Dental Materials — introducing us to the different properties of the myriad of materials used in dentistry. I was satisfied in achieving a 3.44 GPA for my first quarter. After having been removed from an academic environment for two years, I was a bit concerned that it might take a quarter to adjust. Actually, after the first week I felt right at home!

The members of my class certainly are a large part of my enthusiasm for dental school. I was surprised to find among the ranks a lawyer, a woman with a Master's in Genetics, a housewife with three young children, and several Pharmacists. We are certainly a varied group and we are getting to know each other very well after more than a few late nights in lab!

Besides my classes I was selected to serve on the Admissions Committee by the Director of Admissions. This was quite an honor for me and a large responsibility as well. My duties include screening applicants' files, interviewing, and voting on the candidates. As one of two first year student members, each of our votes has equal weight with any of the other committee members. I enjoy this work very much and although it is extremely time consuming it is a position that I feel is very worthwhile.

Once again I would like to thank you for giving me financial support this year. I appreciate it very much.

# Names in the News . . .

Helen Holly Hatton,  $\Gamma\Theta$  - Drake, former city editor of the Battle Creek (MI) Enquirer and News, wrote a special article for that newspaper which touched off a series of events that eventually improved the quality of living for many. The article was so impressive that Dan Martin, the paper's managing editor, sent it on to Gannet News Service to be run on their national wire service. In addition, Gannett ran an ad inspired by the story, which appeared in Gannett newspapers nationwide, in the New York Times and Wall Street Journal and in the December 8, 1980 issue of Time magazine. By now there are probably hundreds of people who may benefit from what began as a small local story.

It is the story of Theda Yarnell of Battle Creek who suffered almost total loss of sight as the result of an eye infection. For 26 years she was legally blind. With her reluctant agreement, her family took her to Dr. William Feinbloom at the Eye Institute of the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in Philadelphia. With the glasses he invented, Mrs. Yarnell's vision is improved from 5% of normal to 90% of normal . . . 100% for reading. The 74 year old doctor, wishing to make the glasses available to as many as possible, has never patented them and has donated his practice to the institute.

The glasses resemble opera glasses and extend about two inches from the spectacles but the fact that they make her look like something out of "Star Wars" doesn't bother their happy wearer.

Many doctors and clinics had been unable to help Mrs. Yarnell. An inflammation of the retina had caused a series of small hemorrhages, each of which had left scar tissue that blocked most of her sight and left spots of peripheral vision. When one group of doctors suggested that her eyes should be removed, she swore never to seek help again and almost refused to see Dr. Feinbloom when her family read of his new approach. When she finally saw him, it was to find that he looked for the small parts of the eye that were undamaged, rather than at the damaged portion, as the other doctors had done. Then, using prisms,

camera lenses and a microscopic eyepiece that magnifies up to 30 times greater than normal images, he designed the glasses to "pull it all together". Dr. Feinbloom did not expect the glasses to be quite so successful for Mrs. Yarnell and credits part of the success to her own unwillingness to give in to her blindness and her constant struggle to use what little sight she had retained.

Everything she sees delights Mrs. Yarnell. Soon after donning her new glasses she was handed a box of Special K cereal. Before, she could barely make out the big red K; now she can read even the fine print. She went on the greatest "sight-seeing trip" anyone could take; reading everything she could get her hands on; trying out new recipes; identifying the players in the Battle Creek Symphony Orchestra, for whom she had served as president of the Symphony Women, their major fund-raising group. She walked through the autumn days and enjoyed every ordinary sight but added, "You cannot truly appreciate the sunrise until you wait for it in darkness".

Of her interview with Mrs. Yarnell, Helen Hatton says that although previous stories were written about the glasses, this one probably had such impact because of Mrs. Yarnell's willingness and ability to express emotion and to explain both her handicap and how her glasses help. Gannett offices were inundated with calls to ask for more information about the glasses; Dr. Feinbloom's clinic phone "... kept ringing off the wall". It is impossible to know how many people contacted local optometrists or how many have received new hope.

In his editorial about the article, Dan Martin wrote, "Mrs. Yarnell is nearly blind, a seeming contradiction for a woman who has amazing insight into the hearts of others. Her sight failed but her confidence and good spirits soared and she never gave in to the darkness of despair." Of her reaction when she put on the glasses, he said, "She could see. She could cry, too, but not for long. The first person she called was her friend Helen Hatton, who asked if she could write about Mrs. Yarnell's joy and thereby inform other partial-sighted persons about a treatment which might bring them aid." Mrs. Yarnell's joy was repeated often when Helen's story led others to investigate the glasses for their own use. Mr. Martin, whose column appeared shortly before Christmas, wrote, "That's what you expect from two women with warm and gentle hearts during a season that's designed for warm and gentle tales."

Helen wrote to me about her own life . . . "My late husband was an engineer and we lived in many places, including the high Andes of Peru and in Alaska. I took time from newspapering to raise our family of three boys. Careerwise, I've also worked for Dr. Gallup on a poll measuring story ideas as movie possibilities, at the News Sentinel in Knoxville, TN, and for 17 years in Battle Creek at the Enquirer and (continued on pg. 14)

Mary Challenger Burnham, H - Wisconsin, Major, US Army, Retired, is the national president of the Women's Overseas Service League (WOSL), an organization of women who have served overseas with the armed forces in time of war. Membership is drawn from women who served in World Wars I and II, the Korean conflict and Viet Nam. WOSL was founded in 1921, following World War I, and since that time has sustained a varied program of dedicated service. In recognition of patriotic community service, the League was awarded the George Washington Honor Medal by the Freedoms Foundation in 1965, 1968 and 1970.

Initially dedicated to the needs of the 90,000 service women who returned home after World War I and, except for army and navy nurses, were not entitled to hospitalization or other benefits or assistance, WOSL is the only organization for women from all military branches and volunteer services, as well as including women of allied nations. Many are still not covered by benefits but through trust funds set up by some of the original members in their wills and through later contributions of other members, WOSL continues to aid members in need.

As president of WOSL, Mary travels frequently but manages to find time for membership in AAUW, the Photographic Society of America, the Camera Club of Greater Milwaukee and the Retired Officer's Association. After her retirement from the service in 1960, Mary worked as a civilian dietician for 15 years and enjoyed vacationing in unusual places. Now she enjoys reliving her trips through her photography.

Of her wartime experiences, Mary writes, "It was on a cold December afternoon in 1943, aboard the 'demothballed liner President Johnson, that we sailed under the Golden Gate Bridge, destination unknown. Twenty-one days later, after a seemingly endless expanse of water, we entered the harbor of Espiritu Santo just before the submarine net was closed for the night. One of the New Hebrides chain of islands, Santo lies about 15 degrees below the equator. I was assigned as dietician at the 25th Evacuation Hospital set up in the midst of a cocoanut plantation. With almost 1,000 patients in several separate buildings, food had to be delivered by jeep and trailer to each ward. Cooking was done on field ranges with gasoline burners and special diets were prepared on a small 2-burner gas plate. There was no hot water. The metal trays used for dishes were washed in 3 big tubs which were also heated by gasoline burners. Food was brought in by the army; mostly canned and dehydrated supplies from the U.S. We did receive several large ship-loads of fresh lamb from Australia and since the quartermaster didn't have enough freezer space for it, we received a forced issue. It was not the most popular item on the menu and one officer swore he would never touch it. One day we made 'hamburgers' of it, adding chopped onion, bacon and seasonings and that same officer came to the kitchen asking for some of that delicious hamburger meat for a picnic! Once we lost an ulcer patient, a Samoan scout who had been working with our forces. After an extensive search, he was finally discovered in the top of a cocoanut palm, drinking green cocoanut milk, a diet not usually recommended for ulcer patients, but he managed to survive.

After about 9 months I was transferred, by way of Guadalcanal and New Caledonia, to Fiji to join a hospital unit going to India. After

crossing from Bombay to Calcutta, we were met by the commanding general of the theatre and the army band and finally found ourselves established in a 1,000-bed hospital supporting the engineers building the Lido Road and the air force flying 'the Hump' into China. Here, in addition to Army Quartermaster rations from the U.S., we were able to get some fresh foods, especially eggs and potatoes. Both were much smaller than we were used to, but at least they were fresh. We used Indian personnel for everything exept the actual cooking. To see one of them leave the kitchen balancing on his head a large metal-lined wooden box with several inches of hot water and several heavy metal pans of food inside was really something worth watching. A two-week R & R in Darjeeling came as the European war ended and we really enjoyed celebrating with the British there but knew that we still had a way to go.

A three-year tour of duty in the early fifties near Osaka and in Yokohama, Japan, was interesting as the occupation ended and the Japanese became independent. I was in Japan when Dr. Yaeko Kawai returned from her studies with Dr. Rusk and I went up to Tokyo to meet her. We had a strictly Japanese dinner and a most interesting conversation.

Between and following overseas assignments, I was stationed in many areas of this country and attended meetings of many Kappa groups. A Kappa in San Francisco, Elizabeth Blessing Van Kirk, BI-Swarthmore, became a good friend and took me to several meetings of the Women's Overseas Service League. When I returned to Milwaukee after my retirement from the army, I joined the league. I am proud to be the leagues's national president this year and, as you can see, it all started with a Kappa friend!"

Helen Bemert Lovelace,. ΔΓ - Michigan State, was amazed and delighted with the overflow crowd that turned out to honor her as Employee-of-the-Month for the entire University of Michigan Hospital. Surgeons, nurses, volunteers and staff members showed their appreciation for "Betsy's" work as

senior receptionist in the surgery unit family room where she does so much to help worried relatives of patients. Besides her concern for helping an average of 900 people a month at the hospital, Betsy is a devoted and loved adviser to  $B\Delta$  - Michigan and is said to put 110% of herself into everything she does.

The occasion was Rosanna's 75th birthday party, celebrated with the staff of the Evansville (IN) Courier, of which she is the real-life publisher. The call was arranged by the staff and the two women found that fiction and fact are surprisingly similar since Mrs. Enlow took over running the Courier when her husband died 12 years ago; the same circumstances written for the fictional Mrs. Pynchon at "The Trib".

Sandy Ellenwood Burnard, BN - Ohio State, recently appeared in an Arco industrial film hosted by Steve Allen in San Juan, Puerto Rico. She had just completed a three-week run as Daisy Mae opposite Joe Namath in the title role of "Li'l Abner" in the San Bernardino (CA) Civic Theater. In 1980 she also appeared with Daniel Bain in "Two for the Show," a musical revue which included songs, dances and comedy routines from operettas and Broadway shows.

In her four years of professional performing, Sandy has had experience in national tours, dinner theaters, repertory and civic groups and has been involved in everything from commercials to Shakespeare productions. While at Ohio State, she performed each summer in the university's Stadium Theater and was selected as "outstanding freshman" in the School of Music.

Anne Munro Strickland,  $\Gamma Z$  - Arizona and  $B\Psi$  - Toronto affilial is one of three Kappas in Toronto who work with Community Occuptional Therapy Associates (COTA). This group works with patients their homes and helps them to achieve independence despite physic and/or emotional disabilities. Formed in 1973 by five young women who were between jobs and wanted more than domestic roles, the organization put their skills as occupational therapists to work and als filled a need within the community. As luck would have it, the Minists of Health had been seeking just such a flexible group to expand i services in home care programs.

Wendy Campbell, also  $B\Psi$ , is one of the founders of the group whice now employs 46 occupational therapists in the equivalent of 30 full time jobs. Actually, the therapists are not "employees" in the traditional sense but self-employed workers who accept cases on contraction COTA. They may help a young boy who is disruptive and may have a learning disability; a middle-aged woman who is afraid to leave her home; a cerebral palsied baby and the family of a young schizo phrenic who is re-entering the outside world after hospital treatment Each patient receives eight visits of approximately an hour each within a period of about seven weeks.

A non-profit organization, COTA operates as a business whose services are purchased mainly through health agencies but which also sells programs to social service agencies or serves on a consultation basis with private agencies. If architects or engineers need advice on access to a building for handicapped people or Bell Canada needs to install equipment adaptable for the disabled, COTA may be called upon to help.

Anne Strickland is shown teaching 9-month-old Adria McPherson how to learn the technique of walking. Another  $B\Psi$  who works with the group is Sheila Kemp Ritchey. These and other Kappas in Toronto who work in social services, speech therapy and in other areas of service to the handicapped are worthy of recognition in this, the International Year of the Disabled Person.

Delia Bissett Comb, EΘ - Arkansas at Little Rock, is executive director of the Republican Party of Arkansas and writes that, to the best of her knowledge, she is the only woman in the country who serves as executive director for either major political party. Her law degree and membership in Phi Alpha Delta legal fraternity took her on to political involvement. She has been on the board of directors of the Institute of Politics and Government and served as aide, chief sergeant-atarms at the 1980 GOP National Convention and has received awards in her field.

Delia has also served as president and vice president of her Kappa alumnae association and credits the Circle Key grant she received from Kappa as being instrumental in enabling her to attend law school.

Anne McQuillan Leslie,  $\Delta N$  - Massachusetts, was re-elected as "... one of the few Democrats to survive the Reagan massacre" in the New Hampshire House of Representatives and was appointed Assistant Minority Leader and also a member of the Legislative Utility Consumer's Council. Her husband Bob is part of a large legal firm and their three children are in college and in business but Anne still finds time for other activities ... such as earning a green belt in Okinawan Karate.

Virginia Blue Macdonald, \(\Gamma\) B - New Mexico, won her seat as Republican representative in the Illinois State Legislature by a three

to one majority and credits the loyalty of long-time Kappa friends for some of her campaign success.



Nancy Kurtz Falck, ΓK - Wm. & Mary, is a new member of Fairfax County (VA) Board of Supervisors, representing a district of 83,000 residents in a county of over 600,000 people. Past President of Northern Virginia Alumnae Association, she was also president of the Service League, and of the Social Center, a resource for mentally handicapped.

Nancy served on Northern Virginia Mental Health Association Board and she helped develop a pilot program designed to provide for housing needs of mentally ill or retarded. She was appointed by the Governor to two four-year terms on the Board of Visitors of William and Mary. As the first woman officer of that Board, she gained valuable knowledge in the areas of state finances, budgeting, development, and management of educational institutions.

Nancy served on the Fairfax County School Board, which is one of the twenty largest school districts in the nation. She handles a demanding career and also is extremely proud of her husband and their four children, including two Kappa daughters.

Nancy Buchele Parrish, \(\Gamma\) A - Kansas State, is a state senator, the third woman in the Kansas senate and the first woman Democrat to serve in the state body. She has an MA in special education from Kansas U. and teaches in the preadolescent unit at Topeka State Hospital.



Leolene "Jibby" Langford Fox, ΔI - LSU, was appointed Secretary of Culture, Recreation and Tourism by Louisiana Governor David C. Treen. In her state cabinet position, she will be responsible for the operations of the Louisiana State Museum, State Library, Office of State Parks, Tourism and Office of Program Development, which includes the Division of the Arts and the Offices of Archaeology and Historic Preservation and Outdoor Recreation.

Active in Republican politics since 1953 and a delegate to the Republican National Convention in 1972, she has also served on the Republican State Central Committee and was a regional campaign chairman for the governor in his successful race to become the first Republican to head Louisiana state government in more than 100 years.

In addition to her political activities, this busy wife and mother of two has been active in the DAR, her church and the Junior Charity League.

Jeannette Hahner Hayner,  $B\Omega$  - Oregon, has been elected minority leader of the Washington State Senate. In their strongest position in 23 years, Republicans came within one seat of controlling the senate. Mrs. Hayner became caucus leader last year after helping to engineer a coup which ousted the usual hierarchal leadership structure in favor of a three-member committee. As a minority leader who "... will often be able to pick up a vote from the other side", the 61 year old lawyer is one of the most powerful women lawmakers in Washington history.

Barbara Sublett Guthery, B\(\textit{\\\\}E\) - Texas, has been active in Republican politics since high school. She worked with Judy Gleason as Finance director of Marge Roukema's campaign. Together they helped to unseat the six-year incumbent and aid Marge in her victory; one of the most costly congressional campaigns in New Jersey history. Barbara is a stockbroker with Bache in New Jersey.

Judy Gleason,  $\Delta\Phi$  - Bucknell, started working for Congressman (now Senator) William Cohen of Maine in his district office, then in his Washington Office. She also worked for California's Pete McCloskey as his energy specialist and then as legislative assistant and as administrative assistant. Most recently she served as campaign manager for Marge Roukema of New Jersey and is now her administrative assistant.

# The Image Maker

As a marketing consultant, Camille Perkins Lavington, BM - Colorado, relies on creative packaging to help people sell themselves professionally. She draws on her years of experience as a business executive in Fortune 500 companies (see *The Key*, Winter 1976, page 19) and shares her knowledge by guiding clients to form an objective insight into their potential and into the steps necessary to succeed.

Women are on the move in the business world. Today it's no longer a job; it's a career. Labor Department figures show that a majority of women will spend their adult years working, so it is essential for an individual to assess and package her strengths in order to obtain optimum satisfaction and financial reward in an interesting and challenging career role.

At a meeting of the New York Alumnae Association, Camille spoke to a wide age range of professional women on "Your Image" and on the process by which her consulting service defines an individual's goals, on personal styles of communication and on the psychodynamics affecting success. There are two facets to how others perceive you: your identity (height, weight, age, sex, etc.) and your image (what others decide you stand for). Acceptance or rejection may depend on prejudices based on appearance, mannerisms, body language and personal style. The way you communicate plays an important role in your destiny. Education, skills and experience are only part of the total picture. Success comes through interaction with others and the ability to be flexible enough to adapt to an environment and still accomplish your goals. This includes an awareness of business politics and strategies for survival. Camille also stressed the importance of being aware of other people and their needs. The capabilities, training and knowledge that come from a college degree are important, but the ability to get along with the people you work with, on your own level, as well as above or below, is equally vital.

A well prepared résumé states what you want known about yourself and what you are looking for in a career. The ability to react quickly and handle yourself well in a stress-filled situation is essential. Dress the part and play to your audience. These were a few of the specific points

Opportunities for women in the technical fields are wide open. Business Week, September 15, 1980, carried an article in the Corporate Woman section entitled, "What's Needed to Become a Company Superstar." It stated that "... the surest ticket to instant employment, a high salary, and a promising future ... is the combination of an undergraduate degree in engineering, math or science, and a master's degree in business administration."

It goes on to say, "The woman with technical plus managerial credentials — the corporate superstar — has two things going for her."

The combination is useful for all young managers since so much of today's business is technically based. When a woman has the quantitative skills of a math/science background, she can reach managerial levels. Many large corporations are constantly in search of women with technical degrees and MBAs and starting salaries average about \$25,000.

"A positive prejudice about me" is the description one young woman gives to the attitudes of others when they learn about her background. Others agree that people show more respect for the individual who has proven that she has done something technical. It is often naturally assumed that a man understands technical areas and just as quickly assumed that a woman does not.

Personal image, increased salary and the opportunity for advancement are all there for the potential superstar. With her credentials, presumably there is no top rung of the ladder.

Camille enjoys sharing personal and business experiences that relate to her life in the corporate world. Finding that she enjoyed helping others improve their personal images, Camille turned her hobby into a business three years ago when she formed her own company, Lavington Ltd. Her seminars attract corporate executives as well as those who seek help in achieving upward mobility.

By evaluating the image required for her clients, Camille creatively packages a confident, dynamic image necessary to move to the top of the ladder.

# **Volunteer Experience Applied**

You, as an individual, are a vitally important member of the volunteer sector. Take a look at the impact and effect volunteering has on so many aspects of your life. Today you can begin personal documentation of your professional skills and training. By identifying your volunteer hours and expenses, and then comparing them against a realistic base, the hours you give . . . the telephone calls you make . . . the meetings you attend will become a valuable tool in developing your career.

Here are some tips for developing your personal record packet: Calendar (use your personal calendar to keep whichever records fit your needs. Schedule meetings and projects as usual then fill in distances traveled, expenses, and time working on projects at home or agency. Order a "Kappa Calendar" - it is super for containing enough space to write in everything!) Volunteer Job Documentation (make up a sheet on your job - list the agency, dates of service, address, phone and person you worked with at the agency. Describe your job — be specific as to duties, responsibilities, and qualifications needed such as skills, experience, characteristics, and list the time requirement.) Volunteer Mileage Record (This is for tax records and convenience in recording the miles you drive to and from volunteering. The Internal Revenue Service allows 9¢ per mile deduction for your travel, and this standard deduction is found under the charitable deductions section of the IRS form. Rule off a plain sheet of paper with date, destination, volunteer activity, meter reading at start and stop, and total miles. Keep this in glove compartment of car and fill it in each time — instant records!)

Begin collecting newspaper articles on you and your participation in volunteer events; workshop/course outlines from seminars, etc. you have attended; exam/training reports/resumes and results of projects you have done; certificates; copies of proposals written; lists of books read; programs from performances; exhibits; writing samples; verifications of conversation/work/study with experts; awards and honors; licenses - pilot, broker, real estate, cosmetology, day care, other; military records; mementoes; letters from — co-workers, clients, peers, supervisors, trainers; accomplishments — photographs, art work, speeches, publications, designs, audio tapes, slides, video tapes, recordings, etc.

# Working with learning disabilities Keeps Kappa Polly Behrmann Busy

This Kappa really became interested in children's learning disabilities when her son, who has an IQ considerably above average, was put in sixth grade classes for the retarded. POLLY BEHRMANN (Marion Polly Piper Behrmann),  $\Delta N$  - Massachusetts, is now Special Education Consultant and author of nine books and numerous articles on the subject. Polly's contribution has resulted in a better understanding of learning-disabled children than in the past, when Thomas Edison and Winston Churchill were placed in this group.

Polly's collegiate days were spent during World War II and just after its end. Men on campus were few, and the Kappas were a close group, very supportive of each other. Her attraction to the "blue and blue" was due to the manner in which the Kappas rushed her. After her freshman year in the dorm, Polly moved into the Kappa house for three years, graduating with a B.S. each in Education and Recreational Leadership. Polly's Kappa sisters from college are still her very best friends.

Shortly after graduation, Polly contracted rheumatic fever. As she was unable to be a classroom teacher at that time, she began home tutoring of children with special learning disabilities, those physically handicapped or mentally retarded. She continued teaching, tutoring, and working as kindergarten director during the years her family was growing. James, her first child, is now a doctor of psychology with a divinity degree, and Judith, her only daughter, is now married and a teacher. Polly's third and fourth children were both learning disabled.

Learning disabilities are very much misunderstood by the general public. Learning disabled children are not mentally retarded. Quite the opposite is true. Usually they have average to very high intelligence, and because of this, are very frustrated because they know they should be able to excel.

There may be 100 different combinations of learning disabilities. Fine motor or gross motor skills, eye to hand coordination, and color blindness are some common learning disabilities. It is difficult for the classroom teacher to know all the variations in learning disabilities, and cope with a full classroom of students.

Polly likes most to work with classroom teachers and educate them to simple ways of aiding learning-disabled children. Hanging an alphabet around the room is one simple aid. Some children should be allowed to print instead of the mandatory cursive writing. It is easier for them to write with a felt-tip pen instead of a ball point usually required. Color blind children find it easier to use pink paper with green lines in place of the commonly-used white paper with blue lines, which is less distinguishable to them. It also helps to use a yellow highlighter felt pen to draw attention to important facts. The hands-on concept works well for 10-15 year old children, feeling and viewing at the same time.

Learning disabled children with difficulty in communication skills will have problems in reading, writing and arithmetic as well. Children with motor coordination problems can best be By Features Editor Carol Cheney Williamson ΓΨ-Maryland

brought along a step at a time, much as would a person recovering from a stroke. Learning-disabled children become wonderful adults, because they have learned to cope with many obstacles.

In late February, Polly was a speaker at the Conference for Learning Disabilities held in Atlanta. This has been a frequent activity of hers from 1966 to the present, during which time she has spoken at numerous colleges, universities and public school districts. She has attended conferences of the Association for Children With Learning Disabilities (ACLD) throughout the United States and Canada.

On Mondays through Thursdays at Upham Public Schools in Wellesley, Massachusetts, Polly is Special Educator at the Resource Center. In 1979, she was named Massachusetts Mother of the Year, and has received awards from several states: Oklahoma, Arkansas, Connecticut, Tennessee and Virginia, for her work in learning disabilities. Polly is listed in the following Who's Who: American Women; International Women; Learning Disabilities; American Colleges; Outdoor Education: Education.

Those of you familiar with *Highlights* magazine for children may recognize her column, "Around the House," which appears in the parents' pages. She co-authors this column with Joan Millman, who has also joined her in several book endeavors. Books she has either authored or co-authored include:

Polly's son, who was the stimulus for her laudable career, has completed college and is now a computer technician. Her youngest son, who was also learning disabled, is now married and an apprentice plumber.

# A Walk Through The Reference Process



- 1). Alumna writes a reference or alumnae reference committee writes the reference.
  - Check rush dates to be sure references are sent early enough so the chapter can use them as a rush tool.
- 2). Alumnae reference committee or State Reference Chairman countersigns references.
  - An alumna from an unorganized area should send the reference directly to the chapter if the rushee is from the same unorganized area.
  - Rushee from organized area, alumnae reference chairman from the rushee's home area countersigns it.
  - State Chairman signs reference on a rushee from an unorganized area when the reference has been written by a Kappa from another unorganized area.
- 3). Completed references are sent to the chapters.
  - Alumnae are strongly encouraged to send references early.
- 4). Rushee pledges Kappa Kappa Gamma.
  - Completed reference is sent to the director of membership, and alumnae are notified of rushee's affiliation.

# References — A Rushing Tool

Did you know that six chapters received over 400 references before rush began in Fall 1980? In addition 11 chapters received over 300, 13 had over 200, and 30 had 100 or less. That is very impressive, coupled with the fact that Kappa's loyal and dedicated alumnae sent over 18,000 references for the 1980 fall rush. Thank you alumnae for your wonderful support and interest!

Kappa's best rushing tool is our active member, but in addition to this person-to-person contact, the reference is an ideal rushing tool, providing information for conversation which will make the rushee feel more comfortable with the Kappas. How are our chapters using the references to better know the rushee?

- Summer newsletter sent to chapter members including information from the references, name, hometown, and activities.
- During pre-rush work week or retreat references are flashed on opaque projector in a "flash card" session to foster familiarity with names and activities.
- Compiled in notebooks to be reviewed by members.

- Used in mock rush party situations for practice in rotation groups.
- Information for conversation topics.
- Reference pictures used on posters or bulletin boards to make a composite picture with color coding borders, i.e, legacy, academic achievement.
- References reviewed by chapter interest groups (interest in athletics, similar hobbies, volunteer experience, etc.)
- References passed around while the chapter is sitting by classes, rotation groups, or hometown areas
- Have competition between classes, rotation groups, big/little sister pairs on who knows the reference information or pictures best. Award prizes.

In order to give prospective members an excellent rush, the chapters need to have the references and need to have them early. The more time the chapter has to spend learning the information on the reference, the more effective their rush will be. Isn't this what it is all about? Please send references and send them early. The alumnae's continued support is immeasurable.

# PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY

Question: Can you tell us a little about the origin of Par-

liamentary Procedure?

Answer: Parliamentary Law is a set of rules designed for

the orderly and fair conduct of business in a

deliberative assembly. It embodies a philosophy devoted to order, fairness, protection of the rights of the individual member, the minority and the absentees. The majority rules.

The first beginnings of Parliamentary Law are unknown, but it undoubtedly came into use as soon as people started to work for the common good in an assembly of some sort.

The concept of bylaws goes back to the Anglo Saxon village moot or folk moot where "bye-laws" were made. Anglo Saxon settlers brought the moot and the bye-laws to the British Isles in the 5th century AD. There the village moot or folk moot became the "Shire Moot" and the "Shire Court." The Normans, after the Conquest, set up the Great Council consisting of barons advising the king. The Great Council developed in time into the body which we now know as the Parliament. The Parliament was governed by certain rules which in the 16th century resulted in the printing of two slim volumes: The Journal of the House of Commons and the Lex Parliamentaria printed in 1689.

Parliamentary process was brought to America and used in the House of Burgesses and during the Constitutional Congress. It was the foundation of the Constitution.

Thomas Jefferson's Manual published in 1797 is still used in the Senate and in many State Legislatures. In 1876 Henry M. Robert's Pocket Manual of Rules of Order was published. It has been edited repeatedly. The latest edition is Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised.

Question: Why should Parliamentary Procedure be fol-

lowed at chapter (or alumnae) meetings?

Answer: Any meeting, regardless of its size or informal-

ity, will benefit from the proper use of Par-

liamentary Procedure, which is the implementation of justice through democratic process. The chairman will be aided in disposing of the business on hand quickly and fairly. The members will contribute through full and orderly participation to the decision making process, and the minutes, kept by the secretary, will provide a legal record of action taken. The use of proper and effective procedure will equip actives for their future work in professional organizations, PTA's, Women's Clubs, politics, board rooms, etc.

Therefore it is of utmost importance that not only the chairman, but also each of the officers and each individual member, inform herself on her rights and on the rights of others and of the assembly as a whole.

The National Association of Parliamentarians, with state and local units almost everywhere in the U.S. and Canada, provides a variety of services directly or through its units. Many adult education programs offer low cost courses in Parliamentary Procedure, and many civic minded organizations host workshops open to the public and conducted by local parliamentarians. Local parliamentary units would be glad to hold a workshop or give a lecture for a chapter or alumnae association.

# Kappas Teach Skiing In Handicapped Program

The snow has been meager in the Rockies this season, but the generosity of Beta Mu (Colorado) Kappas who teach handicapped skiing has continued to exist in abundance. This year sophomores Laura Melges, Andrea Greene and Kelly Chapman have devoted at least one day each week to working with the disabled at the Lake Eldora ski areas about 30 miles west of Boulder.

The program involves over 150 instructors and students from all over the state. The girls started their training for the program last fall with sessions in dry-land and on-slope skiing as well as intensive training in particular skills used in teaching the handicapped.

"These people are only handicapped in certain ways," says Andrea. "You've got to remember that because they are just like anyone else." The handicapped program includes emotionally, mentally, physically and financially disabled persons. Each student is assigned to an instructor. The two meet at the ski area and work on basic skills or racing since many of the students compete in slalom and giant slalom, whether with crutches or outriggers (poles with skis) or even with the aid of their instructors. Andrea coaches the handicapped racing team at Eldora, and she was excited for the competition facing the group at the National Handicapped Championships in Winter Park (Colorado) the end of March.

"Watching these people cross a finish line is amazing," says Andrea. "They are so ecstatic whether it's taken them a few seconds or several minutes." Teaching the disabled is Andrea's favorite thing to do. She taught handicapped skiing last year with three other Beta Mu Kappas — Kathy Swanson, Timi Atkinson and Jose Lewis.

The instructors claim that skiing greatly helps to overcome a handicap because it is something everyone else does. Even when these people have difficulty walking and maneuvering man-made barriers of steps and doorways, once on skis they are able to find a new freedom and a new kind of mobility. Learning about themselves and others through training and competition makes the program exciting and fulfilling for all involved.

Sister Lynn Thomas, director of Maryvale, however, noted the importance of following-up the afternoon visit with letters. Sister Thomas said the girls often feel neglected and rejected because they receive only one-time visitors. To prevent this low self-esteem, the pledges decided also to become pen pals with their newly found friends.

Prior to the event, most pledges had felt apprehensive and awkward about the planned encounter. By the afternoon's end, however, uneasy feelings were undetectable. Bike riding, talking, ping-pong, tag and leap frog occupied the time while friendship grew between the orphans and the pledges. The orphans, ranging in age from eight to 15 years, were very receptive to the smiles and laughs shared with them. For all present, the time passed too quickly, but the day saw the start of friendships to last.

# THE KAPPA WAY

Membership in Kappa Kappa Gamma is more meaningful to those members who know Kappa, its philosophy, its past and present activities, its growth, and the personalities and experiences of its leaders. Fraternity Education thus becomes an ongoing element in chapter life, beginning during the pledge period and continuing on through the active and alumnae years. It can best be described as any event or resource that enhances one's membership in our Fraternity. Consequently, a chapter's Fraternity education program may cover a wide range of topics which is designed to help members achieve an understanding of our organization.



Organization is vital if the incorporation of Fraternity education into chapter programs is to be successful. The second vice-president is ultimately responsible for Fraternity Education programming. However, it is generally recommended that a chapter appoint a separate Fraternity Education chairman, who with the help of the program committee members, will develop the appropriate FE programs for the chapter. Involving as many chapter members as possible will bring about innovative ideas and enthusiastic support for the chapter's FE program. Individuals, committees, chapter officers, or anyone with a special interest can be involved in the preparation and execution of an FE program.

Fraternity education programs often vary according to the needs of the chapter. These needs are determined at the time of the chapter evaluation. Planning ahead is the key to an effective FE program. It is imperative that the FE chairman and program committee write down their goals, specific methods they will use to achieve these goals, and a calendar of proposed dates incorporating the methods listed. Coordination between the FE

and chapter program should be achieved at the time the chapter calendar is being determined. Chapter events should be supplemented with creative FE activities. Many FE and chapter plans can be combined to provide high quality programs, effective use of time, and that special knowledge that we as Kappas share.

It is especially important that each FE chairman and program committee member be aware of the resources available for her use. Officer notebooks, chapter archives, and Fraternity Headquarters are good sources of FE materials. And what does one do with these resources? A creative mix of Fraternity education events makes FE programming fun and interesting. A blend of serious FE programs with FE games, poems, allegories, and bulletin boards tends to meet the needs of most members. Many chapters schedule a program night each month whereby a chapter officer is responsible for making a presentation to the chapter on a particular facet of her area of responsibility. For example, the treasurer presents the budget and graphically shows where each dollar is to be spent. Members make out their own bills as part of the educational process. The FE chairman acts as a resource person to the officer and her committee. She might suggest the officer utilize slide shows, bulletin boards, and outside speakers. Ideas for presentations continue to grow as chapters discover and explore the possibilities of enriching their Kappa experiences through fraternity education.

Whatever the age of the Kappa or the chapter, the Kappa experience will continue to grow, and a key factor affecting that growth is education — Fraternity Education — an important part of our chapter Total Program.

# WHAT IS THE MOST IMPORTANT INGREDIENT FOR A SUCCESSFUL RUSH?



One additional comment deserves attention and that is that we must help our actives have the ability to be friendly, ensitive, informative, genuinely sincere and aware of the uniqueness of each rushee.

# HOW CAN OUR ALUMNAE BEST SERVE THE ACTIVE CHAPTERS IN THE RUSH PROCESS?

Comments ranged from helping in the kitchen, taking coats, and providing late-night snacks to everyone's saying the best vay to serve is to provide accurate information on the membership data sheets. They all reflect the importance of the eferences, but with the understanding that our chapters have the privilege of final selection.

# WHAT IS THE LARGEST CONCERN OF OUR ALUM-NAE IN THE MEMBERSHIP SELECTION PROCESS?

It is interesting to note that each Kappa I asked responded with thoughts dealing with the reference process. Our alumnae re concerned about the young women they refer and, in some ases, their "favorites." This applies pressure on the chapters. However, the chapters must be cognizant that using such tools is letters to alunnae reference committees, acknowledging references received and helping reference committees through the use of a "key girl" program, all aid our membership selection process and the cooperation between actives and alumnae.



# WHAT IS THE BIGGEST CONCERN OF OUR ACTIVES IN MEMBERSHIP SELECTION?

Pledging women who will fill the needs of the chapters in terms of leadership and continuity, and who possess high standards and are compatible in a chapter — these are the actives' concerns. Another interesting thought is that with increasing interest in rush and higher quotas, our chapters are concerned about programming for larger pledge classes and selectivity in rush with such large numbers.

# HOW CAN WE BEST ADDRESS THE CONCERN OF ALUMNAE AND ACTIVES ON THE LEGACY ISSUE?

This is a tough question to deal with, because of the emotional aspect of the issue; but most everyone responded in a similar fashion. Education of both the alumnae and actives as to the unique position of the legacy in today's rush is essential. The alumnae need to realize that increased numbers of legacies going through rush has changed legacy policies drastically during the past several years. On the other hand, the actives must be educated to the fact that the legacy is a special person and deserves extra consideration. A top-notch rush adviser can be instrumental in assisting a chapter in recognizing the value of pledging legacies, and alumnae presidents and reference chairmen can help in their communication with local alumnae.

Every fall, Kappa's active chapters begin the school year "walking and talking with their mind on Kappa." It's an exciting season, this that we call "rush." Always a great beginning, and this year was no exception. A record high in number of references sent to our chapters, a continuation of high interest in the Greek system and successful rush programs produced outstanding pledge classes. We can all be proud of the combined efforts and dedication of actives and alumnae in furthering the quality of Kappa Kappa Gamma.



# Province Meetings Now and Then

Kappas who have attended province meetings are well aware of their importance. They offer many members, actives and alumnae alike, an opportunity to travel a relatively short distance at proportionately low cost for programs and workshops with Fraternity leaders. An informal exchange of ideas with Council representatives, province, alumnae, and chapter officers, is encouraged. New groups are welcomed, and other groups with outstanding service or performance records are recognized within this area setting. Time for inspiration, relaxation, and fun is always planned for those who have assembled. As a result, new friendships are formed and old ones strengthened.

When today's efficient organization and obvious value of province meetings is considered, it is difficult to realize that they have only been scheduled on a regular basis since 1931, even though the country was divided into three provinces in 1881. Enthusiasm for the occasional province "conventions and sub-conventions," as they were then called, during the first 50 years provinces existed was as high as it has been the second 50 years.

Some quotes from *The Key* that will demonstrate remarkable similarities and differences in province gatherings of today and yesterday follow:

1885 - From an article on sub-conventions -

"In the chapter reports in this number of the KEY, we publish an account of a sub-convention held by Kappa and Xi at Hillsdale, Mich. This convention is specially remarkable as being the first of the kind ever held by chapters of Kappa Kappa Gamma. . . . There is no reason why there should not be a sub-convention in every state where Kappa Kappa Gamma has two or more chapters some time during the interval year between the national conventions. We do not believe in district conventions, because our provinces are too large to permit all the chapters to be represented without making some sacrifice which would recoil upon the national convention of the next year. But the chapters in a state could meet with little expenditures of time, money and energy; and these informal, non-legislative meetings of near neighbors would create an intelligent interest in fraternity government and policy which would increase instead of diminishing the attendance at the national convention. . . . "

1885 — From a chapter letter titled "The Second Sub-Convention" —
"A convention of Alpha Province of Kappa Kappa Gamma was held with Tau
(now Beta Tau) Chapter, Thursday and Friday, October 22 and 23... A
business session was held Thursday afternoon in the chapter rooms, at which the

1891 — From an article about an Alpha Province Convention —

"All day Wednesday, September 23, the Kappa girls of Beta Tau Chapter might have been seen gaily vibrating between the station and their several homes, watching for bright faces and golden keys. . . . A delightful evening was spent becoming acquainted with Sisters whose paths had never before crossed. . . On Thursday evening from eight until twelve o'clock the parlors and halls of the Vanderbilt House were crowded. Among the hundreds who paid respects to the young ladies were college professors and their families, alumni and alumnae, undergraduates and prominent citizens. . . Stationed behind a floral bower in the hall, Kapp's orchestra discoursed sweet music. On the long tables where . . one of the best collations known to students was served, reposed a magnificent floral piece, the gift of Phi Kappa Psi fraternity. . . ."

1895 — From an article about a Gamma Province Convention —

"Whether or not a province convention be practicable and profitable is a question which has been before Gamma Province for some years, but an adequate answer has come only with the recent convention held with Eta, at Madison, Wis., Feb. 15-16. . . . However, the truth was brought home to one with great force, that the ideal condition would have been a full attendance of the active membership of the province . . . and the second oldest woman's fratemity did not seem so absolutely young and entirely without history or traditions, when through the bonds of the golden key, college women could greet those whose enthusiasm had not expired with 13, 15 or 20 years membership in Kappa Kappa Gamma. . . ."

1923 — From a report on Iota Province Convention — "Some of the recommendations from the committee follow:

Eventually provision was made for the province meeting expenses of officers and delegates. Further progress was made when a training school for province officers was instituted in 1967. Associate Council Seminar, as it now is known, takes place in Columbus, Ohio, biennially in June, in the alternate years of general conventions.


# 65th Anniversary Celebration
