

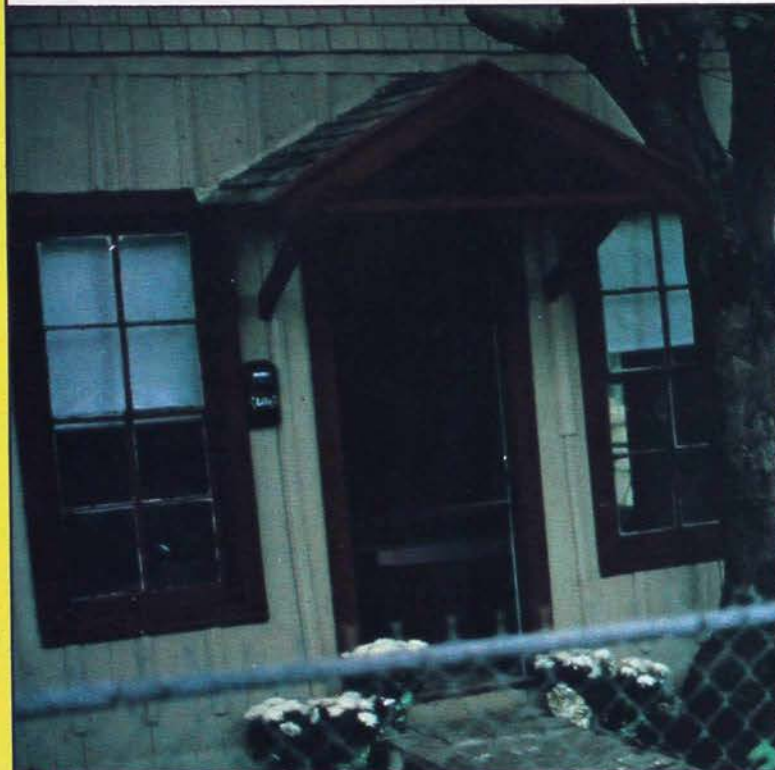

Fraternity Parliamentarian

Almost 29 years ago, on May 15, 1950, I first set foot on American soil. And for me, like so many others who had come before, the future was full of surprises. If somebody had told me then that 30 years later I would be asked to be the parliamentarian of Kappa Kappa Gamma Fraternity, I would have thought that person was mad, indeed, because I would have had absolutely no idea what that forecaster of fortune was talking about.

I had just arrived from Germany, where I was born and raised, and was on my way to start summer school at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, as a foreign student. Before I was to move from Evanston 5 years later, I was to become a Kappa, a wife, a mother and a U.S. citizen in that order—but not yet a parliamentarian.

At that far away point in my past my name was still Sigrid Ruedel, but Higgi to family and friends, of whom I was to acquire many in a very short time. I had studied architecture at the Munich Institute of Technology, but enrolled at Northwestern summer school in the Liberal Arts program, class of '52. In the fall of 1950, now in my second quarter at N.U., I went through rush, encouraged by many friends who felt that I should participate in this unique aspect of American college life. I took rush very seriously and after much deliberation, even though the choice

was quite easy, I pledged Kappa. This was a very happy decision for me. I took to the friendly and sisterly spirit of sorority life immediately and was fortunate enough to get permission to live in the house even though I was only a pledge. (My husband still gets upset when I tell him that living in the Kappa house was the happiest time of my life!).

In January, 1951, I was initiated and in March I was married to Bob Crane. With this my career as a student and my life as an active ceased. I have, however, found Kappa sisters who became instant friends wherever we lived, including places as far away as the small Arab Emirate of Bahrain in the Arabian Gulf. Also, Bob's grandmother, mother, sister and several aunts all were initiated into Kappa Kappa Gamma. I can truly say that I am surrounded by Kappas wherever I go.

Bob and I have spent most of our married life in Northern Virginia, where we raised our daughter and twin sons. Here I have been active in the KKT Alumnae Association and have held almost every office including the presidency at one time or other. Activities in Kappa and many other organizations prompted me to take up parliamentary procedure a few years ago. What had started as a necessity turned into an interesting field of study. I became a professional, registered parliamentarian in 1976 and am presently a member of

the Grace Welborn Unit of the National Association of Parliamentarians, the Virginia State Association of Parliamentarians, the District of Columbia Association of Registered Parliamentarians and the National Association of Parliamentarians. I have helped conduct community workshops on Parliamentary law, have judged contests on parliamentary procedure, and have served state and local organizations as parliamentarian and/or advisor on amending and revising bylaws.

In the meantime, the young Cranes have flown the coop. One of our sons is still a student at Northwestern University. Bob works as a consultant on long range planning specializing in the Middle East. I am directing program expansion for a promotion and marketing firm.

My new responsibility as Fraternity Parliamentarian will be a great responsibility, but also a great pleasure. I will do my best to justify the trust put in me and I am looking forward to the challenge of serving Kappa Kappa Gamma.

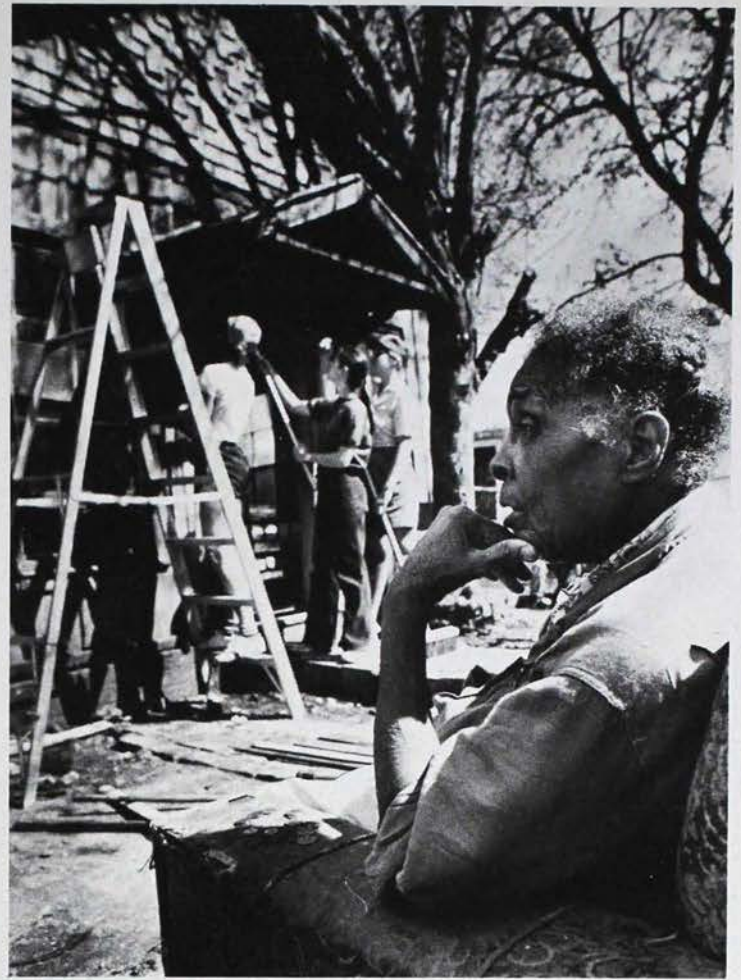

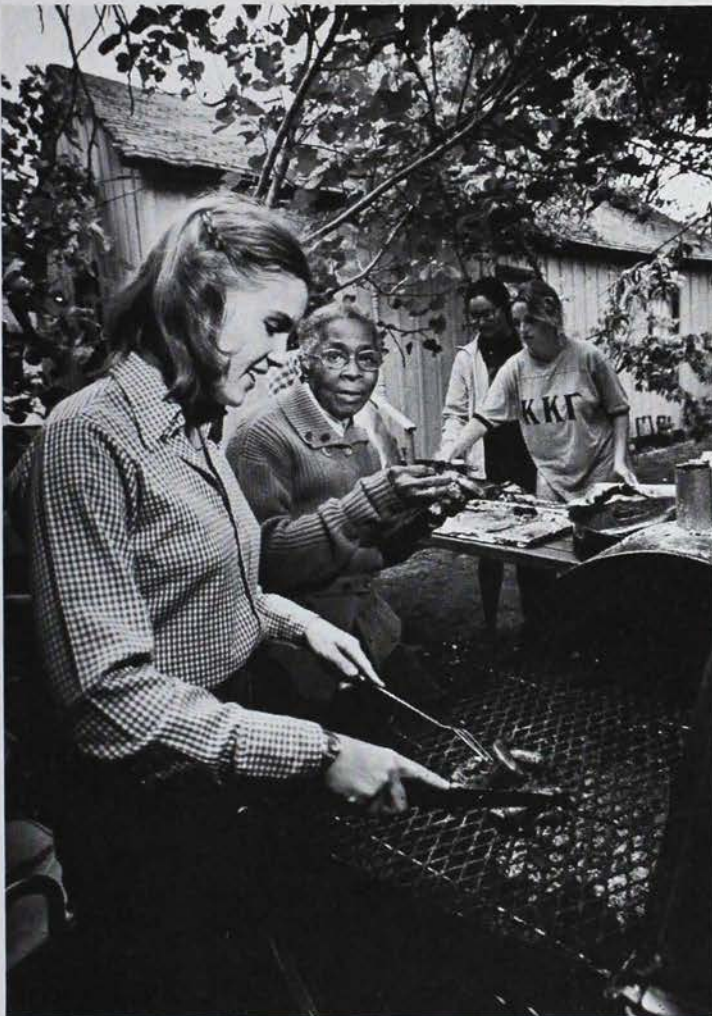
"A Good House"

The chapter council of Beta Xi at the University of Texas held an officer retreat the end of January to plan activities and set chapter goals for the year. One of our major goals was to plan one large philanthropy for the entire chapter. A special committee was organized to research the possibilities. We had in mind doing some type of renovation project so we could actually

scrub, sand, and paint. We felt we could achieve real chapter unity through our work, and at the same time our eyes would be opened to a less fortunate society. Through Gay Goforth of the State Human Resource Department we finally narrowed our possibilities down to one house in central Austin.

The house chosen for the project had no working plumbing, no running water (hot or cold), one working burner on the oven, one small floor heater, dangerous and inadequate electrical wiring, a leaking roof, slanted foundation, and no insulation whatsoever. From these details you can imagine that the general appearance of the house was *very* rundown. A black woman, Lillie Rayford, 76 years old, has lived in the house since the 1940's. Her niece, who is probably about 40-50 years old, is now living with her as a part of a Homemaker Live-in Program sponsored by the Federal Government.

Our first reaction to the project was that we really couldn't do it . . . it was far beyond what we considered when we thought of a renovation project. I guess we all had in our minds the basic Coke commercial project where we could plant flowers in the front yard and put on a new coat of paint . . . then an elderly woman would come out on the front porch and serve us soft drinks on her oak serving tray. The condition of this house would involve much more than flowers and a new coat of paint! We were talking about plumbing, electrical wiring, appliance repair, insulation, and more before we even got to think about painting! We were appalled that a house in this condition could even exist in Austin, much less within a mile of the Kappa house.

February 2 we went to talk to the lady and her niece about our project. We were excited to find that they were very receptive to the idea. We made a special point to impress upon them the fact that they were helping us by giving us this opportunity, and that we would need their help during the project.

After visiting the house we knew the project was worth following through at all costs—and we were excited about the CHALLENGE of raising enough money to cover the cost. Now all we had to do was convince the chapter council that we could get the money and fit it into our social calendar that had been put together months in advance. In the past our biggest philanthropic effort had been a picnic with the underprivileged children . . . how would the chapter react to a project that might take weeks?

The night we presented our project to the chapter they all seemed really interested in the idea. (I can bet that they too had the “Coke commercial image” in the back of their minds!) When we showed the first slide a groan went over the whole room. Some were even laughing at the idea of our renovating such a house. There were a few comments like, “why don’t we just get a bulldozer and plow it down, and start all over again!” As the slide show went on however, you could tell a change in tone of the chapter. The laughing and humorous comments began to die down and it got pretty quiet—which is a feat in itself in our chapter meetings! After the slide show we again asked their reaction to the project and it was positive.

Obviously, we were unable to do the plumbing and electrical work ourselves, so local businesses were contacted who discounted their services. The Human Resources Department contacted an architect who was willing to help us free of charge. As far as our work in the project, there was much to be done in the area of cleaning, painting, and repairs both inside and out. The chapter was divided into committees with specific assignments and working hours for each day. Chapter meeting on March 19th was set aside for committees to organize the project. March 21-24 was the week of actual work, and no other Kappa activities were planned during that time so all could focus completely on the philanthropy. We certainly did not expect to get the house on the cover of *House Beautiful* magazine, but our first priority was to make the house “liveable.”

To raise funds a letter of appeal was sent to all alumnae groups in Texas and the chapter planned to hold a casserole and salad dinner (all donated and made by chapter members) with all ticket money being profit for THE philanthropy.

As we tore up heads of lettuce and stuck casseroles into the oven on the day of the dinner, we all began to sing Kappa rush songs. Claudia and I glanced at one another in affirmation that this was the chapter unity that we had hoped to achieve with our project—and we had barely begun. Ten minutes after the dinner

started, someone burst through the kitchen door and said people were streaming clear out to the sidewalk in front of the Kappa house and we could never feed all of them! In our state of panic we went as far as to go to the grocery store and buy spaghetti and meat sauce, but like the Bible story of feeding the five thousand with a couple of fish and a few loaves of bread, we ended up having *exactly* enough!! And with our first fund raising effort we made approximately \$650!

The spring pledges and pledge committee both helped fund-raise with a bake sale (\$30) and washing car windows at Wendy’s Hamburgers and Burger King (over \$60).

The casseroles that fed the five thousand was only the first miracle that occurred. The second one in particular was a blessing in disguise. The favors for the annual Monmouth Duo Formal with the Pi Phis did not arrive on time. We were faced with the choice of reordering favors and receiving them a month after the party, or canceling the order. Since the money for each favor came out of each person’s individual petty cash account, when the chapter voted not to order new favors, each individual could pledge their money to the philanthropy if they wanted to—the total sum of these pledges added up to *four hundred dollars!*

Donations began rolling in from parents and alumnae and one thing we were learning was that it was not the amount of the check that was important at all, it was the sincerity in which it was given. Once our own Austin Alumnae realized that we were serious about the project and needed their moral support very much they really got behind us and the total of their donations turned out to be over *seven hundred dollars!* They not only helped us through their financial donations and words of encouragement, but they loaned us ladders and other supplies that we needed in renovating the house.

On the first actual work day it was like a dream come true. Cars started rolling up and in 30 minutes Lillie’s yard and house were FILLED with eager Kappas. No one turned their back in disgust, or even made side comments about the condition of the house—everyone, and I mean EVERYONE that came to the house jumped in and started to work at a fervent pace. We were accomplishing one of our goals for sure—all of us were quickly made aware that a less fortunate society existed—with glaring reality!

The neighbors reacted in disbelief soon followed by willing helpers (mostly little boys and girls) who flocked to be part of the project. After one or two days most of the kids began to realize it was really hard work, so only Johnny was there every single day and became our “best friend!”

It was on the second day of work that a reporter from the *Austin American Statesman* came to do a story. As a coincidence Lillie’s mail arrived and the reporter looking over her shoulder

noticed the Urban Renewal letterhead. It was a letter of rejection for emergency rehabilitation service on the grounds that it was "not feasible in lieu of the condition of the house." The reporter's tone changed *noticeably*, and it turns out the reporter called the head of Urban Renewal and said something to the effect that a U.T. sorority was out fixing up the house they said was *beyond* repair. The next morning a representative from Urban Renewal was at Lillie's with papers for her to sign authorizing her to receive a grant from U.R. in the amount of \$1,500!!! This money was used to fix the terrible slant in the foundation and put on a new roof—repairs we didn't even consider because of their expense. The Kappas were in complete awe of the timing of the episode!

The next day we discovered that our project was front page news—1/3 page with black borders! Our excitement was indescribable, but the response of the community to the article was even more profound. The phone rang off the walls with firms that would donate linoleum for the floor, plumbing fixtures and other necessities, and many just calling to voice their approval. Hardware stores began to give us discounts and even the county dump let us dump our countless truckloads of junk without the standard fee.

Our talents were drained (and willingly)—an interior design major recovered an old chair—girls took home dishes to scrub—and even a new mailbox was made with Lillie's name and flowers on it. The last week we painted the interior rooms. What an unbelievable improvement it was! The walls that were once a single layer of board with daylight showing through in many places were now normal walls. In the yard we did the final raking, trimming and picking up. I estimate we made 15-20 trips to the dump with *full* loads to clear out that yard. What was once a thicket piled with junk was now a regular back yard! We just had to celebrate so a bar-be-que with Lillie as cook was planned.

We knew it was important for Lillie to feel like she had done something to thank us, so we paid for all the meat and she provided the know-how for the bar-be-que . . . and *man* did she ever know how! We served 25 pounds of brisket, 4 chickens, and beef ribs with chips, ice tea and homemade peanut brittle. The *Statesman* printed another generous article about the bar-be-que and the local news aired the story. At the celebration Gay Goforth presented the chapter with a certificate in recognition of volunteer service. Amidst all the glory of the press and the excitement of finishing the house there was one scene that was far more meaningful than the newsmen and representatives from the Human Resource Department. It was Lillie—as she walked out the door everyone broke into cheers and applause. Then her face broke into the biggest, brightest smile I had ever seen in my life! My eyes filled with tears—it was then

that I realized that the most profound change was not in the appearance of the house, it was in the life of little Lillie Rayford. I thought back to the first time I met her. How she looked at me with a dull, listless expression that didn't seem to contain even a hidden glimmer of joy, and I compared it to the joyful, lively little lady that was before me. I knew that of all the miracles and all of the blessings this was BY FAR the greatest.

Tucked between a cynical newspaper article about the oil companies and a jab at the U.S. House was the most unbelievable comment about the Kappas and Greeks—the editorial:

"Just about the time cynicism is about to take over the mental processes entirely, and you have your stereotypes all lined up like ducks in a row, something nice happens and you think it's not such a bad world after all.

Take something as stereotypical as a university sorority. We all know what they're about, right? Not quite, Kappa Kappa Gamma's chapter at the University of Texas has done quite a nice community service. For the past five weeks, maybe 200 people, most of them from the sorority, have been renovating the shotgun house of Lillie Rayford. With a little help from donations from local businesses, the house is soon going to be a good home for the 77-year-old woman. And it's thanks to a good house—KKG."

Common Denominator for Kappa House Mothers is Love for and Interest in PEOPLE!

Any woman with children, especially teenage children would regard another woman with enormous awe and respect who could meet the emotional and physical needs of sixty or more young women twenty-four hours a day, nine months of the year! Yet, there are many such dynamic women across Kappa-land. They are our House Mothers, or House Directors, as their administrative and managerial skills are becoming more recognized.

What kind of woman is sparked by a challenge such as this? Why is such a demanding job appealing? The common denominator which emerges immediately from all the Kappa House Mothers interviewed this spring is a love for and interest in PEOPLE. Mrs. Floriene Emerick, Gamma Epsilon (University of Pittsburgh), explains, "My interest is in young people and the need to keep 'involved' after mandatory retirement in 1975." On the other hand, Mrs. Vera Hart, Beta Nu (Ohio State University), responded by saying, "After a twenty year career as a hospital dietician and school nutritionist, I wanted more fun!" Mrs. Dottie Smith, Beta Xi (University of Texas at Austin), sums it up this way, "Being young at heart, the opportunity to work with young people attracted me to this work. They can be so stimulating as well as challenging!"

What do they like best about their jobs? The most frequent response was, "being needed, offering understanding, and maintaining a homelike atmosphere." Mrs. Lucille Carroll, or Mama "C" as she is affectionately dubbed, Delta Rho (University of Mississippi), likes "the planning and preparation which is given to special occasions, such as Homecoming or Parents' Day." Mrs. Betty Kizer, Gamma Delta (Purdue University), enjoys "helping to contribute to the growth and happiness of the

girls." Similarly, Mrs. Velma Lewis, Gamma Theta (Drake University), adds, "watching young people grow, as they cope with their hopes, fears and problems."

When asked about their most rewarding or memorable experiences, the responses were more varied. Tom and Judy Mudler, a young graduate school couple who are at Eta (University of Wisconsin) replied, "To be walking across campus with friends and have a Kappa yell 'Hi Mom and Dad!' It gives our friends quite a start until we explain it!" Many find deep satisfaction in being invited to share in house or chapter related activities. "Each day brings some rewarding or memorable experience," replies Mrs. Jean Berger, Pi Deuteron (University of California at Berkeley); "there may be a thoughtful 'Thank you' note tucked in your door, a dozen roses, or just a happy 'Good Morning' that lets you know your girls care." "The small silence, and then hearing the voices in the Kappa Grace when the girls assemble in the fall for their first evening meal together," is most meaningful to Mrs. Vera Hart. Others mention "hearing from 'their girls' after school years and knowing that they still think of her as their mother away from home and special friend."

What or who has been most helpful in carrying out her job? The most frequent reply was "Kappa support—at all levels—actives, especially the cooperation of concerned and caring officers, and alumnae, including house boards and advisers." Mrs. Betty Kizer added that "The House Director Seminar gave me confidence." Dottie Smith, who has been a Kappa House Mother for thirteen years and who has attended twice, commented that "the seminars help renew enthusiasm and spirit."

Having heard from the House Mothers themselves, what do others have to say about them? Mrs. Floriene Emerick has been described as "a positive and contributing influence to the cheerful atmosphere within the house and chapter." Mrs. Betty Kizer is recognized for "her graciousness, her kindness, and her integrity." Mrs. Ruth Oakshot, Beta Pi, (University of Washington), is respected because "she is caring but not interfering." Gracious living is the goal of many of our house mothers; Mrs. Elizabeth Kennedy, fifteen years at Beta Theta (University of Oklahoma), Mrs. Lou Walk, Gamma Alpha (Kansas State University), and Mrs. Gracye B. West, Beta Upsilon (University of West Virginia), are particularly noted in this area. It has also been said of Mrs. West that "one immediately feels that this is a special house as soon as one enters; relationships are hard to describe, but there is mutual love and respect here."

But perhaps how the actives describe these women is most revealing and significant. The girls at Theta (University of Missouri) like to invite outside groups, such as Panhellenic, to meet in their house because they are proud of the hospitality and graciousness that Mrs. Margaret Chancellor provides. Mrs. Gracye West, who has been a House Mother for ten years, is "about as much a Kappa as you can be without being initiated!" Mrs. Jane Stevenson, Beta Rho (University of Cincinnati), and Mrs. Verda Borchers, Rho (Ohio Wesleyan University), among others, are cited as "good listeners." Mrs. Joyce Rainwater, Delta Upsilon (University of Georgia), is "easy going but firm, and serves delicious food." Mama "C", Mrs. Lucille Carroll, is "everyone's ideal grandmother." Mrs. Velma Lewis "has a good sense of

humor," and Mrs. Jean Berger is noted for "the extra touches—fresh flowers, planning menus which include favorite foods, and her 'open door policy'."

The position of a House Mother is like the hub of a wheel, as she is surrounded by the girls, her staff, and the alumnae. Her involvement often runs beyond the campus and into her community. She must walk the delicate tightrope of being friend and confidant to her girls and, at the same time, a firm and competent business manager. And while developing a long lasting, happy relationship with their House Director should be the goal of every housed chapter, the rewards, while not always tangible, are very real. On the part of the girls, it's the love for "their mother away from home;" for the house mothers, it's "seeing and experiencing the personal growth of the girls in the chapter from pledgeship to graduation—and beyond."

Housemother Job Fought Loneliness

President Carter's mother, Lillian Carter, says she worked to overcome the loneliness she felt after her husband's death in 1953 "by being a mother to 105 boys."

She became a fraternity housemother.

"If any woman at age 46 loses her husband and wants to find something to do to take up her whole life—well, that was it," Mrs. Carter told a colloquium on aging at the University of Maryland.—the Associated Press and *IRAC Bulletin*, May, 1979

New House for Vanderbilt Answers Variety of Needs

The only Kappa Kappa Gamma House in Tennessee is located at 2416 Kensington on the Vanderbilt University campus in Nashville.

The 5200 square foot, contemporary, tri-level house was dedicated at an Open House March 24 with the Fraternity President Jean Hess Wells of Atlanta and Fraternity Finance Committeewoman Patsy Piller Shelton of Shawnee Mission, Kansas, in attendance.

The Kappa Kappa Gamma house is the first fraternity or sorority house to be built on the Vanderbilt campus in 15 years. The contemporary house features special interest in the ceilings and different kinds of feelings as one moves from one room to another.

The early American pattern of red brick with textured sand face lends itself to the overall eclectic appeal of the interior design. The Greek letters KKG at the entrance of the house were sandblasted into limestone and these letters were stained to create depth and to keep the signage permanence.

As you enter the front door an amber skylight reflects its subtle glow from an 18 foot cathedral ceiling onto a gray slate floor. The warm tones of the lighting enhance the salmon and taupe wallpaper with an overall design of vertical, miniature fleur-de-lis in the foyer.

The entry, reception room and lounge are located on the middle level of the house. Immediately off the foyer to the left is the dramatic reception area in tones of navy, salmon and taupe with brass and crystal highlights. Custom fabrics were used on all the upholstered furniture. The love seats which flank the slate faced fireplace and hearth are covered in navy linen with a floral design. A pair of French chairs pull-up to match the sofa tones. Two taupe lounge chairs with down cushions provided another conversation area. Sofa tables and blue suede benches flank the sofas. A shrimp colored upholstered desk chair and writing desk enhance the warmth of the setting. Roman shades made to match the sofa fabric maximize the lighting from the front windows. The final touch to dramatize the reception room are navy blue walls. An arrangement of silk flowers on the glass and brass cocktail table in front of the fireplace tie all the colors of the decorating scheme together. Above the mantle hangs a commissioned watercolor painted by Michael Scholfield, a Nashville artist of renown.

The lounge area returns to the taupe and navies with a hint of salmon. An original wall hanging on one story and a half wall adds interest to just one of the several conversation areas. Cubed formica tables and parsons tables accent this room. Louvre navy blinds are featured at the

elongated windows and a rich taupe carpet covers the middle level of the house.

The lower level is reached from stairs in the entry. The lower level accommodates the dining facilities, chapter room, kitchen, snack room, powder room and storage rooms. There is a rattan seating area in the chapter room with a color scheme of yellow, green, white, salmon and blue. Parrot green area rugs are used in the dining room and lounge. The dining room has a parsons table with chrome, wood, and cane chairs. A brass and glass chandelier enhances the dining area. The kitchen has white counter tops with wood stained cabinets and off-white flooring and wallpaper decorates the kitchen in the colors of the lower level. The powder room is papered with foil and taupe with chrome louvered blinds.

The upper level is entered by stairs in the foyer to the dormitories, office, and housemother's suite. The three bedrooms house six officers of Epsilon Nu chapter, according to Vanderbilt's housing requirements. This area is basically taupe in color to allow the actives to decorate according to their wishes. The actives are provided with desks and beds and built-in storage units. To keep a uniformity of look to the exterior, all windows are draped with insulated fabrics in neutral tones. A brick fire escape, a first for sorority and fraternity houses at Vanderbilt, must be available on buildings by 1980.

The eclectic furnished house utilizes the antique and contemporary furnishings purchased over the past six years by Epsilon Nu chapter. Jonathan Rogers of Jonathan's in Franklin coordinated the interior decorating.

In today's energy conscious world, Street and Street Architects of Nashville designed the contemporary house to the sloping site, while utilizing increased insulation, insulated glass and heat pump for energy efficiency. Insulation sheets were incorporated in the walls along with full blanket insulation. Insulated glass consisting of double glass with a partial vacuum between the panes was installed. A heat pump and zoned temperature control system standardizes the temperatures in those rooms requiring varying degrees of warmth and coolness.

The Kappa Kappa Gamma house is one of the first structures at Vanderbilt constructed under the current codes for accessibility to the handicapped. The aggregate concrete walkways in front and to the rear of the house are sloped for wheelchairs. Toilet facilities in one restroom are equipped for use by the handicapped. Hand rails are also available for the handicapped. These individuals can get to all parts of the house.



WHAT IS IT?

It is the international symbol of access which tells the handicapped person, particularly one using a wheelchair, that a building or facility is accessible and can be entered and used without fear of being blocked by architectural barriers. EN Chapter house has been built with this in mind. All Kappa chapters must have a plan so that handicapped individuals can use their facilities, according to federal regulations.

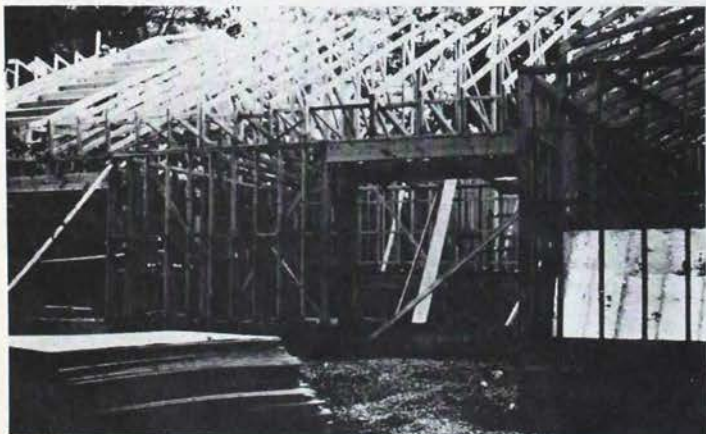
Another hidden feature of the house is a smoke detector system installed in the skylight of the foyer and in the dining area on the lower level.

The kitchen is equipped with a Jennair range which has three different sections for normal cooking or grill use, thereby offering versatility in meal preparation. The patented system of the Jennair draws air down through the grill and to the outside for exhaust purposes instead of using the conventional overhead exhaust. A commercial sanitizer dishwasher is also installed and a breakfast bar.

Street and Street Architects, 1808 West End Building, most recently received awards from Tennessee Society of Architects in 1978 for the Mayfield Student Housing and in 1976 for Sarratt Student Center, both located on the Vanderbilt campus.

Cookin' and Cloggin' for Mental Health

Miami Alumnae Association members combined good times and work for their local philanthropy in a barbecue dinner and dance to raise funds for the Mental Health Administrators' Program.

A full moon and mild temperatures blessed the party at the estate of Muriel "Kigi" Laub Thomson, ΔK—Miami, as 130 Kappas and their guests "clogged" and square danced to the music of the Sourwood Blue Grass Band. (Clogging is the mountaineer's jig.) A "fantastic" committee composed of Ruth Molyneaux Kennedy, ΓX—George Washington, alumnae president; Marilyn Mayes Hicks, BX—Kentucky; Marnie Loehr Drulard, ΔE—Rollins; Martie Hamilton McCullough, ΓP—Allegheny; Genna Brown, Υ—Northwestern; June Randall Thompson, also ΔK; Betty Davis Cabell, BY—West Virginia; Diane Hall Oman, also ΔK; and Joan Adams Fenton, ΔA—Penn State, organized dinner, dancing and a raffle, all of which brought proceeds of \$1,000 which were donated to the Mental Health Administrators' Program.

A new concept in the field of mental Health, the MHAP serves the needs of those who not only suffer from mental illness but also are involved in the criminal justice system. It focuses primarily on expediting the identification, evaluation and court disposition of mental-

ly disordered defendants in order to eliminate as much stress as possible. It also urges the use of outpatient treatment as an alternative to institutionalization and helps provide the framework for successful implementation of this alternative as more judges see its value.

Introduced to the program by Florence Jacobson, MHAP assistant director and a personal friend of Joan Fenton, the Miami Kappas who work with the program believe that they are the only volunteer group of this kind in the country. Besides collecting clothes and preparing personal kits for the "clients," specially selected volunteers work on a one-to-one basis with clients. These women had to be caring, responsible individuals who were then trained for their work. Their eyes were opened to a side of life they had never seen before when they visited the jail and the South Florida State Mental Hospital. They were thrilled with the responses of their clients . . . for many it was the first time that anyone had cared for them as individuals. Volunteers found that helping someone so isolated and in such great need lifted their spirits as much as they helped others.

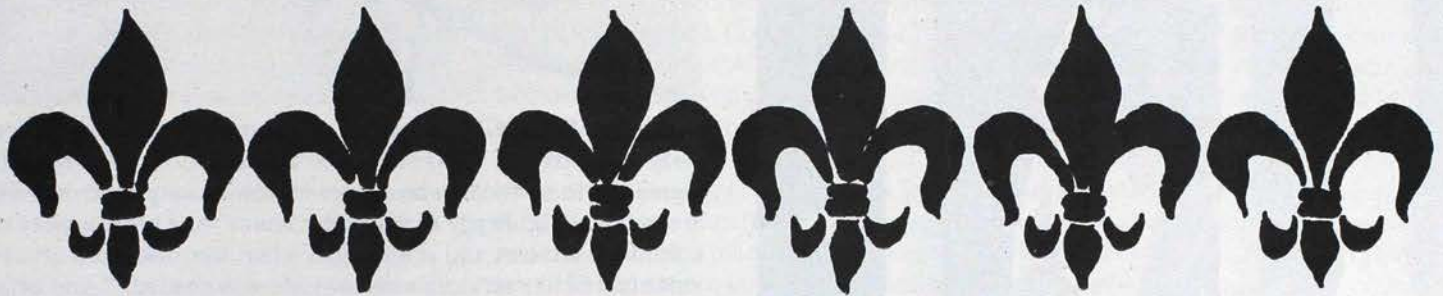
The success and fun involved in the project for the Kappas and the community assures that they will have another tour next year.

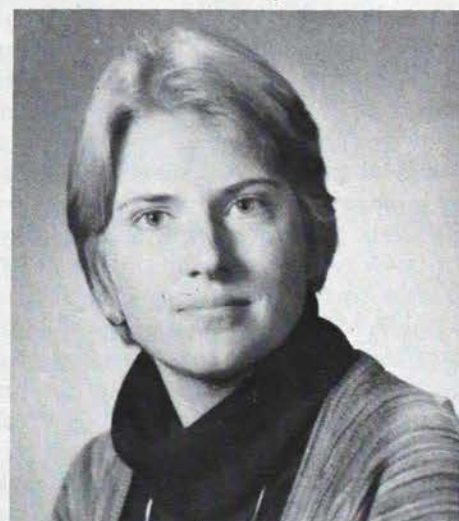

Barbara Bond "Rene" Heider, H—Wisconsin, assisted in conducting a "Quality of Life" conference sponsored annually

by the Auxiliary to the Lehigh County (PA) Medical Society and the Allentown YWCA. She has a private psychotherapy practice and is an accredited clinical social worker.

Carolyn Kemmler, ΔZ—Colorado College, runs the Office of Public Adviser of the California Energy Commission. With a master's degree in psychology and 18 years of experience as a lawyer, her job is to insure that full and adequate participation by all interested groups and the public at large is secured. Her office is one of only two such that she knows of in the country.

Caroline Parkhurst Lloyd, ΓB—New Mexico, composer, pianist and harpsichordist, wrote an opera entitled "Dona Barbara" while living in Venezuela. She is currently performing on concert tours.

Susan Krill-Smith, BM—Colorado, is a licensed social worker and director of the new Self Center, a component of the Addiction Research and Treatment Services Division of the University of Colorado Medical Center. One of the few in the region to serve women exclusively, the center offers a 3-6 month residential care program combining education and therapy and is unusual in that it allows a woman to make a commitment to the treatment while maintaining family contact.

What IS Retirement?

Editor's note: Ruth Branning Molloy, BA — Pennsylvania, chairman of chapter histories, who wrote the article, is a unique woman and perhaps the most interesting Kappa I have ever known. It is a privilege to call her a friend. It was she who prompted me to research and write "Plan to Enjoy," the article on planning ahead for retirement in the Winter 1978 issue of The Key. Ruth's own views of retirement are stated here. May I add: Ruth Molloy will never retire from living and enjoying life to the fullest.

A questionnaire I filled in once, asked, "Do you identify with a group?" I answered *no*, and a friend I was reading my answers to laughed at that. She thought I identified more with a group (at that time it was my chapter, the now defunct Beta Alpha) more than anybody she knew.

That was long, long ago, and now many of my friends, including the one who laughed, have gone into a retirement village or are making plans . . . other groups to identify with.

That life is not for me—not yet. If I were not able to hobble to the supermarket (and my feet sometimes tell me that that is my future), if I were alone, frightened at night, tired of getting meals (I am tired of doing the dishes), if I liked the almost exclusive company of people my own age or older—maybe some other ifs (including if I had a great deal of money and could afford the luxury)—then, I might consider life in a retirement village.

I was born in New York City in July 1910, and since 1921 I have lived in Philadelphia. I like living, walking, and "doing" in a city. Most retirement villages are in beautiful suburban or rural surroundings although some are now realizing that there are people who prefer city life and acting on that realization. Since 1968 when we, my husband and I—our three daughters were married and not nearby—had to sell our house to the city to make way for University of Pennsylvania building programs, we have lived on a little side street in the University area, and we have no wish to change our row house for any other dwelling. Our street is St. Marks Square; it is 100 years old this year; it is historically certified. This means that the porch roof cannot be taken down nor the facade painted yellow. We are 26 houses, 13 facing 13, rather plain faced but somehow distinctive. We are all ages, ranging from a year old baby to 90. We are a pretty well-educated bunch and that has been the case for nearly the whole lifetime of this little street, because we are close enough to the campus to make living here of interest to faculty members. But, aside from the faculty, we have an interesting group and we do identify with that group: faculty, student, white and blue collar, etc.

An architectural historian called St. Marks "the best street in the city" and an architect friend explained, "It's because of the people. You care about each other and the street, and you do things together." Another friend who had lost her mother at 17 told me that living on a street where there were grandmother and grandfather people her children could get to know was important to her. It's equally important for my age group to see

tots and teenagers, young married couples, middle-aged women and men, even people older than we are, and to be on everyday, dinner-exchanging, visiting, hob-nobbing bases with almost all of them.

We are independent, yet interdependent. When my husband had to go to the hospital in the night, my neighbor was on hand. When we were stranded in freezing temperatures and no taxi was available, a neighbor came for us. When one neighbor opened a little shop, nineteen of us attended the opening; when another gives a concert we turn out to hear it.

A few of us die, of course, and some move away. We have many newcomers, and it is fun to meet them. We have an annual street celebration. St. Marks Square Day, in May, and a flea market in the fall. We have Fourth of July street picnics. We exchange parties at Christmas. But we do not interfere with private lives, and we are all living on our own. Our facades are the same but our interiors vary!

This year, for the street's centennial, I wrote a 200 page history of St. Marks Square. We have had many important men and women in this block over the years: Margaret Mead, that most famous non-Kappa, was a baby here, a famous Philadelphia lawyer was a boy here, the inventor of the Univac lived here, the director of an important musical organization lives here, today, and many, many professors and theologians have given our street the name "Brains Alley."

I suppose if I were living in a retirement village I might get terribly involved too and would go about taping memoirs and discovering secrets. I was delighted to hear from Rheva Ott Shryock, BA-Pennsylvania, that just about the first thing she did after moving into Dunwoody Village was to offer to rewrite its bylaws. That's our wonderful Rheva!

The most appealing thing about making a move to a retirement village is that it does force you to get all your worldly goods in order, to make decisions about what is kept and what is thrown out, what is given away, what is sold at auction. It is good to make these decisions yourself and not have your friends cursing your sloppy habits after your death. One friend discovered that her mother had saved eggshells, hundreds of them. I have a collection of hubcaps and I shall see that they are disposed of properly. Nobody is going to get a chance to put them in the trash.

And sometimes mistakes are made. Rheva again! She had a carton containing all her Kappa Keys to take with her to Dunwoody and somehow it got mixed up with the cartons going to the *Nearly New Thrift Shop*. When she phoned the shop, after she had had a little while to get accustomed to her new surroundings and relax a bit, the shop told her, "Oh, we sold that box of magazines!"

Rheva has a fleur-de-lis on her door and many other signs of her Kappa membership in her lovely apartment. Now if I were going to fix up a little place out in the country I wonder what I'd do . . . it might be fun . . . except for all those trees and all that countryside!

St. Marks Square, I'll never say *goodbye*!



Kappa Loyalty Fund Report

Happiness is . . .

. . . the really spectacular growth of Kappa Kappa Gamma who is 109 years old with (would you believe) 109,000 members! What has happened to Kappa since the Loyalty Fund Report was made just one year ago? Well, 18,000 alumnae have paid dues to their club or association, and 3,300 new Kappas were pledged making a total of 8,500 active members (compared to 7,000 two years ago). This is the era of the greatest growth in membership for Kappa in her history. Four new chapters were added to our rolls: Epsilon Chi at Dartmouth; Epsilon Psi at Santa Barbara; Beta Eta Deuteron at Stanford was reestablished; and Epsilon Omega was installed at Dickinson. Where will Zeta Alpha chapter be? Could it be at the University of Vermont or at Babson College? Kappa has accepted both invitations. The goal of Kappa has been one dedicated to "quality growth" with 17 invitations declined and three presentations to be made to campuses in the fall.

A new province in the northeast has been established. Rho Province becomes Kappa's 17th province. Alpha province has been redistributed and you will read about the new borders and province officers in the fall issue of *The Key*.

Campus problems continue to be those of drugs, falsification of records, cheating on exams, and anorexia. Alcohol (featured in the winter issue of *The Key*) will continue to be central in programing and presentation at the 1980 convention. There has been a rise in hazing, vandalism, rowdiness, increased law suits, and a decrease in alumnae involvement. We have 386 alumnae groups and that offers a challenge for the year ahead!

The financial situation of Kappa is sound. The Loyalty fund has generated \$104,500 this year from 5,550 donors. The listing accounts for gifts from May 1, 1978 through May 1, 1979. The average gift was up 20% from last year and averaged \$18.80.

Thanks to your generosity the Loyalty Fund has been able to provide computer operation for the half-million operating budget, a new system of chapter finance, and in-house chapter audits. A new printing press has been installed at Fraternity Headquarters, and salaries of that staff have been increased 7-10% to keep up with the cost of living. A new museum at the Headquarters building is currently being planned (read about this in the fall issue of *The Key*).

In addition to contributions to the Loyalty Fund, alumnae have provided \$150,000 to Kappa philanthropy—\$100,000 in higher education (\$50,000 of that to the Graduate Counselor Program) plus \$50,000 to Rose McGill Fund. (\$20,000 of the Rose McGill Fund comes from magazine sales. If each Kappa just ordered one magazine through this service!)

The insurance program has been most successful, and surely the recent province meetings with a combined attendance of over 2000 (2-3 times that of a general convention) spelled success in capital letters. SUCCESS!

With the continued giving to the Loyalty Fund our Fraternity can look forward to a future of growth and continued excellence.

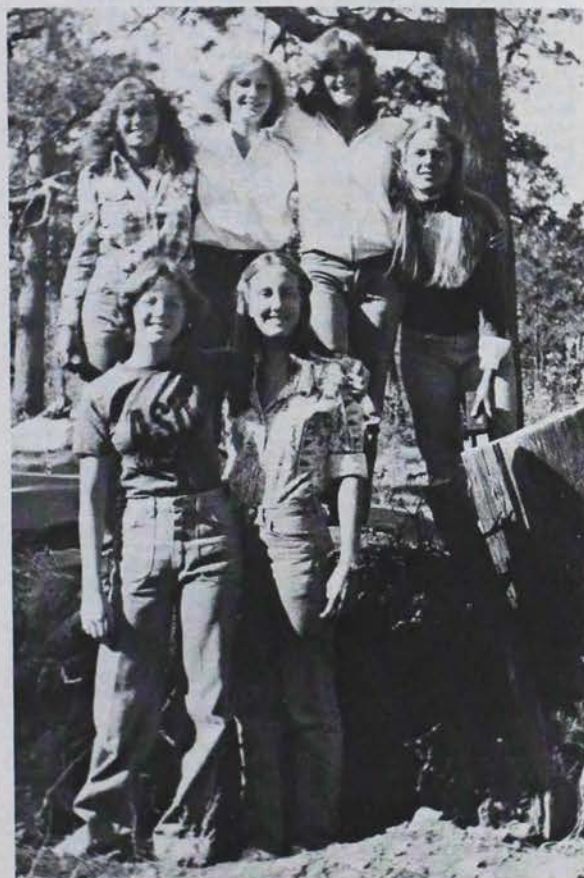

Dartmouth Fraternities Receive "Stay of Execution" by Trustees

Fraternities and sororities at Dartmouth College were granted a "Stay of execution" by the Board of Trustees when it voted in February to ask for an evaluation of the fraternities in twelve months.

The Greek organizations were threatened with abolition when the Faculty of Arts and Sciences made that recommendation to the Trustees earlier this year because of alleged "Animal House" type behavior.

The Board commended the Faculty for their concern "and for initiating a productive debate that has stimulated a process of constructive self-evaluation by the fraternities." They also commended the Interfraternity Council for its positive response to the Faculty action and called for a continuing process to "Bring about significant and constructive change."

The Fraternity Board of Overseers is to furnish the Trustees with a progress report in six months and a full report in a year; and the Faculty of Arts and Sciences is to make an independent evaluation to be submitted within twelve months.

The Board warned that should significant changes not occur, they would be prepared to vote on the abolition of the system.

THE KAPPA FORMULA

The theme for Province Meeting 1979 was The Kappa Formula. What is the Kappa Formula? Conceptualized in its simplest form we would see it written as K_2G . As such, it has two components—two parts of “K” and one of “G.” But as a formula it is merely a symbolic expression of an idea so let us then explore together its meaning.

Take its component parts—“K” and “G.” The development of the alphabet is a modern concept—modern in the relativity of man’s recorded history to the total development of man. Ancient civilizations, feeling the need to put into visual form a written expression for the concept of ideas, developed an alphabet. The word alphabet itself comes to us from the first two letters of the ancient Greeks—Alpha and Beta. Tracing the written language back to one of the earliest attempts to devise an alphabet we find the Phoenicians, who wrote from right to left. To the Phoenicians, “K” meant “kaph,” written as Ψ , meaning “the palm of your hand.” The Greeks, borrowing from these early Phoenicians, called it Kappa (χ), flipped the letter over and then wrote from right to left. The letter “G” also came from the Phoenicians, or “ghimel,” meaning “camel,” and was sounded as “G.” The change to Gamma in Greek was easy and became the third letter (γ) in the Greek alphabet. (Later the Romans sounded the letter as “C” which has survived in our alphabet today.* “You see? It’s as easy as A—B—C!”)

Now, with this in mind, let us return to our Kappa Formula— K_2G .

The name of our fraternity is Kappa Kappa Gamma—or $\text{KK}\Gamma$. But actually this is only our name to the outside world. What we are really using is a monogram, for the Greek letters only *represent* the name of our Fraternity and is not our name at all. The name itself is among the information known only to our members.

Actually, in writing a Kappa Formula, we could either visualize it as a chemical or a mathematical formula. In a mathematical formula, we would write K^2G , as K to the second power and G, and K^2G , which in itself would be interesting to examine. However, for the purposes of this discussion, let us view it as a chemical formula, for within Kappa we have all the chemistry at work to produce a truly dynamic result.

Written as a chemical formula, K_2G (like H_2O), it is the symbolic expression of the composition of its parts for a *substance* which we shall call, in this case, “Fraternity.” And as such, it is an empirical formula which can be explored to express the *results* of a quantitative analysis indicating the number and kind of atoms involved.

Let us think then of Fraternity as the *substance* composed of one part Kappa actives, and one part Kappa alumnae combined with the bonding ingredient of *knowledge*, that shared knowledge that makes us unique from all others. Therefore, we arrive at the formula, $K_2G =$ (equates) Fraternity.

Now let us look at The Kappa Formula in another light—that of a synergistic formula—that the total is greater than the sum of its parts. The total is Fraternity. Its parts are actives and alumnae—together.

Taken separately, if there were only Kappa undergraduates, we would not have *true* Fraternity. We would have a string of independent chapters strung out across this entire continent intent only upon their own adventure. If there were only alumnae, we would not have *true* Fraternity. We would only have independent clusters of post graduates loosely connected to a central purpose.

For in order to have *true* Fraternity, we must have *both* undergraduates *and* alumnae. The actives give meaning and purpose and are the well spring of life for the Fraternity, regenerating and renewing, strengthening our very existence. And we must have alumnae for they are the continuity, the mainstay of our existence. Each of us must enter this Fraternity through an active chapter. But, at best, we spend only four years in a college chapter and we spend a *lifetime* as an alumna. The union of these two, both actives and alumna, is what gives Fraternity its meaning, each learning and growing, each giving and receiving. Thus, the Fraternity becomes greater than the sum of its parts.

In all province meetings assembled, we who are a widely scattered and yet closely united bond of college women, have come together that we might strengthen this bond within Kappa Kappa Gamma through our increased knowledge. The province meetings, then become the catalyst that puts The Kappa Formula to work.

*“K . . . the eleventh letter of the English alphabet corresponds to North Semitic KAPH and Greek KAPPA. The Romans, adopting the alphabet from the Etruscans, at first had three symbols, C, K, and Q, for the k-sound. K fell into disuse. It did not appear in English until after the Norman conquest, when, under Norman French influence, it came into use in place of C to distinguish the pronunciation of words of native origin; such words as CYNG became KING; CENE—KIN; CENE—KEEN; CNIF—KNIFE; AND CNOTTA—KNOT. Under other influences, often through loan words, the symbol entered into more general use.

G . . . the seventh letter of the English alphabet developed from North Semitic GHIMEL and Greek GAMMA. The Etruscans having no meaningful distinction between the g-sound and the k-sound in their language, used this symbol for both. When the distinction again had to

Delta was the first to convene in the month of February and found a snow storm its biggest problem, while Mu province assembled in sunny Miami and Kappa province enjoyed the warmth of Tempe, Arizona. Beta Province had the distinction of being the first all women's group to stay in residence at the formerly all-male University Club in Oakland (Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania). Epsilon Province celebrated its 25th anniversary at the banquet where Candace Franklin, Y—Northwestern, appeared wearing Fraternity President Jean Hess Well's dress (a surprise to Jean who was the honored guest) in a skit put on by Upsilon actives, covering the history of Epsilon Province.

Theta Province enjoyed a true Texas-style bar-be-que and heard a talk by Dr. Linda Daniels who is the director of the famous Johnson—O'Connor Research Foundation which specializes in specific aptitude testing in order to identify one's potential vocational and avocational pursuits. Zeta Province especially appreciated the materials from the alcohol awareness workshop and the "swap shop" idea exchanges which were also popular in Gamma and Eta Provinces. Lambda Province found the charm of Williamsburg inviting while Nu Province actives loved staying at the BX House in Lexington, Kentucky, where 90 girls resided free of charge.

Omicron Province heard Lou Helman present "Our Manners Are Showing." Most provinces answered role call with a special message—for example, active delegates of Omicron Province responded with chapter goals—"The Perfect Total," ΠR² (Participation, Respect, Recognition), "Upward Bound," "United Sisterhood—US," and "Let's Get Organized."

Iota Province shared a luncheon with all Panhellenic friends—two from each of the 14 sororities came to listen to Phyllis Brinton Pryor (Kappa NPC Delegate) give the State of

Panhellenic address. Father Caffrey (Chaplain) spoke on "Sorority—Viable Today" and was well received. Guest speaker Betty Mullin Jones, past president of both Alpha Phi and National Panhellenic Conference spoke to Beta Province.

Each Province Meeting featured devotionals, role calls, business, elections, awards, reports, and any recommendations that the province wished to make for Council consideration. Two examples of such recommendations were to create a rotating Fraternity award for chapter philanthropy, and also to study the size of the pledge pin (to enlarge it).

Workshops were really the backbone of the meetings. All shared workshops on membership, alcohol awareness, and ritual. Most meetings also presented officer training,

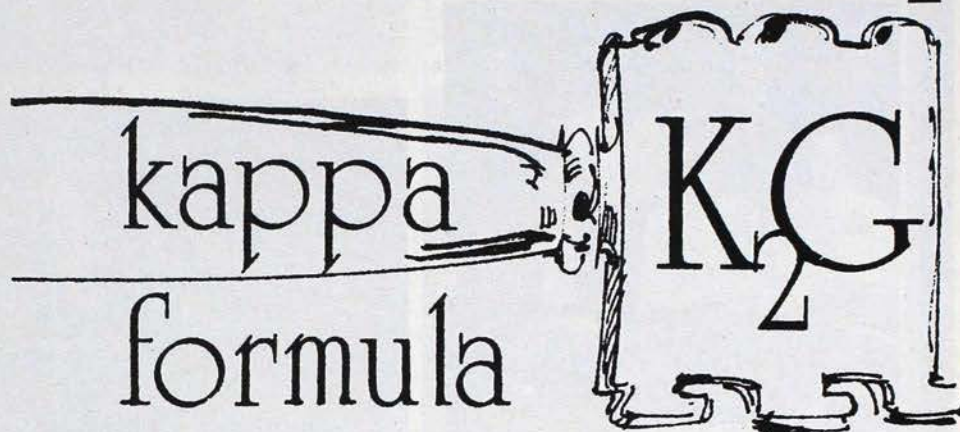

In planning for the future, Council has announced the formation of the seventeenth province—Rho Province. In June, Council divided Alpha province by keeping Toronto, Montreal, London and the state of New York with BB^A—St. Lawrence, BT—Syracuse,

be made in Latin, the small stroke was added to the lower curve of the C. The miniscule is a scribal variant of the capital.

C . . . the third letter of the English alphabet developed from the North Semitic GHIMEL and Greek GAMMA through the Etruscans in whose language there was no meaningful distinction between the g-sound and the k-sound and who used C for both. In Latin, C, pronounced like English K, was used mainly before A and O, and retained this sound when introduced into Britain. The capital and miniscule, which assumed their present form in Latin, were originally angular and faced to the left, as in North Semitic ghimel and early Greek Gamma." from *The Random House Dictionary of the English Language (Unabridged)*

From the age of Egyptian Pharaohs, the Phoenicians copied their rocks which used a phonetic shorthand composed of consonants for sea trade intentions, to quickly list profit and debts. It became time's greatest invention. From the Phoenician Aleph and Beth, the Greeks got Alpha and Beta, then they named it the alphabet.

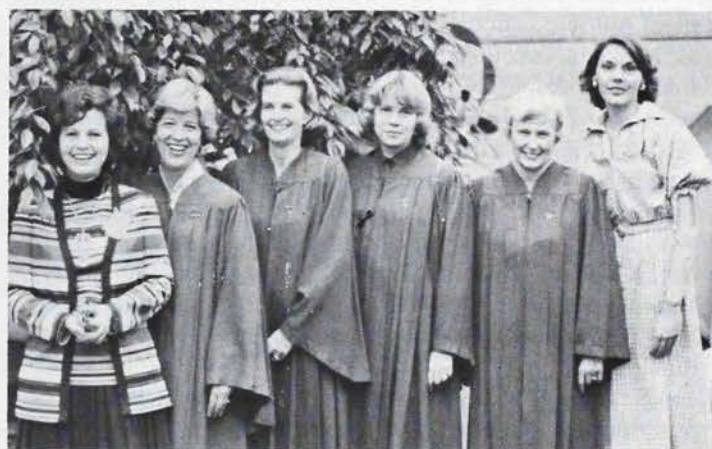

Hazing Policies

An Open Letter to all Chapters of the Fraternity

Hazing practices occurring across the country, similar to the recent incident resulting in the terrible tragedy on the Louisiana State campus, have focused national attention upon the Greek system as a whole on college and university campuses.

The thoughtless, immature, and irresponsible behavior of the few has brought general discredit to the good of the whole and the benefits to be derived from fraternity membership.

While we have every confidence in our Kappa chapters, it is essential that we once again reaffirm the Fraternity's position in regard to pre-initiation activities:

Standing Rules, Rule IX

All pre-initiation activities shall be dignified and constructive.

Policies of the Fraternity, Hazing

The purpose of the pledge period is to provide an educational experience leading to an appreciation of the Fraternity and an understanding of the privileges and responsibilities of membership. All pledge activity must respect the dignity of the individual. Any activity which is demeaning, embarrassing, injurious mentally or physically to an individual or a group, is considered hazing and is not permitted.

Policies of the Fraternity, Initiation

Letters to the Editor

It is the desire of Council to preserve the dignity and solemnity of the Fraternity rituals, and, to this purpose *no* alcoholic beverages may be used in conjunction with these services. If any of your activities could be construed as hazing, eliminate them. If you are in doubt, ask. Any chapter found to be in violation of these rules and policies of the Fraternity shall be subject to immediate disciplinary action.

Reminiscences of a Founder

On Founders Day we will pay homage to six Alpha Chapter Kappas—the young women who marched into the Monmouth College chapel, proudly wearing their shiny new keys, the morning of October 13, 1870. However, during the first 60 years of our Fraternity life, only four founders were recognized.

According to Louise Bennett's (later Mrs. Joseph Boyd) account of Kappa's beginnings, she, Hannah Jeanette Boyd, and Mary "Minnie" Stewart (later Mrs. W. W. Nelson and then Mrs. L. A. Field) planned their Greek letter fraternity for women some time during the 1869-1870 school year. They then "admitted to their solemn councils" Anna Willits (later Mrs. Howard Pattee). These four made decisions regarding their new society's form of government, motto, and badge.

By early April they were sufficiently well organized to have pledged and initiated two more members, Susan Walker (later Mrs. A. S. Vincent) and Louisa Stevenson (later Mrs. W. O. Miller). Badges had been ordered from a firm in Pittsburgh, but they didn't arrive until after these initiations had taken place. So it happened that by the time the golden key made its first public appearance, it was worn by six rather than the original four Kappas.

The Convention of 1876 voted to designate that day, October 13, as Founders Day, because no earlier charter date could be determined accurately. The Convention of 1930 voted to add Sue Walker Vincent and Lou Stevenson Miller to the list of founders because they had been members of the announcing party.

Mrs. Vincent died in 1897, so she never knew about the posthumous honor bestowed upon her. Mrs. Miller was living in Kansas City, Missouri, in 1930. Although she had been a member of its alumnae association for many years, her contact with the Fraternity as a whole didn't resume until she became recognized as a founder.

(Moving pictures were made of this pageant at the time of presentation. If that film has survived, Fraternity Headquarters would love to learn about its location!)

Lou Miller attended only three Fraternity conventions (1930, 1932, 1936), where her stories of Kappa's infancy became highlights of the meetings. She was present at Alpha Chapter's reinstatement October 13, 1934, after which she observed that "sorority girls of today are about the same or a little better than those of 60 years ago." When she died in December, 1937, she was eulogized as a spritely, humorous, fun-loving spirit.

Mrs. Miller helped write and direct a four-act play, depicting Kappa's earliest days, for the Kansas City Founders Day Banquet in 1931. Her handwritten commentary was sent to Fraternity Headquarters by the Kansas City Alumnae Association before the 1970 Convention and was on display in the Centennial Museum. It is a remarkable document, inasmuch as Mrs. Miller was nearly 80 years old when she wrote it. It begins with a little poem, describing the first six Kappas, and continues as follows, with some minor changes in spelling and punctuation (and some editorial notes):

"Minnie Stewart was our leader,
Minnie stood fast through woe or weal.

Jennie Boyd advised us wisely,
Jennie was Kappa's balance wheel.

Sue Walker was our beauty,
Our Sue never seen surpassed.

Anna Willits, a born Portia,
Solved our problems, held them fast.

Louise Bennett helpful, useful,
The still water that runs deep.

Lou Stevenson, the youngest Kappa,
Always a good girl when asleep.

"In presenting this picture of the first Kappas and some of the outstanding affairs of our beginning, I have as nearly as possible after all these years stuck to actual facts, in words and actions. We might have made a better picture and possibly one more attractive, had we trimmed it up a little, but we decided to show the first six Kappas, Mother Willits, and Mrs. Stevenson just as near like they were as possible. Jennie Boyd, Anna Willits, and Lou Stevenson are strikingly lifelike—also Mother Willits and Mrs. Stevenson. This may be because they are wearing some of the clothes and jewelry worn at the meeting portrayed in Scene First.

"Kappa's business meeting which began so very formally in the best parlor at the Stevenson home ended up so informally, because of spying boys. You will be interested to know, some of the furnishings used in this picture were in this home at the time of this meeting—May, 1870. Back of the croquet ground a hedge of iris was in full glory, and it was here and at this time we decided our flower (would be) the iris. But not the colors—they were decided on later as Alice Pillsbury has told us in *The Key* "with no discussion."

"When Mrs. Westermann, Della Burt, and I were in Monmouth last fall at my brother's house, Mrs. Westermann, after seeing some of the Kappa relics, said, "Mr. Stevenson, do you remember anything about this meeting at your old home of the first Kappas Mrs. Miller tells us about?" "Yes," he said, 'I remember *all* about it. It was the first and only time I was ever sent out of a room, and it left a lasting impression.' He said it with a chuckle, but he didn't chuckle in 1870 when I led him out of the room! This brother 'Willie' you will see tonight (is) very true to life. The youngster who so well takes this part is Robert Brewster, whose mother portrays one of the six founders. He (Willie) had been left in my care for the afternoon.

"Scene Second is at the Willits' home—the opening of the box containing the first 12 keys. It was decided, as Mrs. Willits had made the pattern for our badge and placed the letters as they are today—they should be opened in her presence, and that she should be the first to see them tried on. Jennie Boyd was the custodian of the keys. It was at this meeting, she, raising her hand and

I remember that frolic and fright! I went home with Maggie Duer from school to help get things ready as she was to be initiated. Five girls were initiated. As you will see tonight, this initiation was very simple indeed. At a meeting at Sue Walker's we took in after the holidays two more Kappas—Rhetta Hedden and Josie Thompson. Now we numbered 13. I have been asked how we got the 13th key. Well, we were not ready just yet to send in another order, and it took some juggling to make 12 keys do for 13 Kappas. But as O. O. McIntyre would say, we 'handled it.'

"I have also been asked, 'How did you get your Greek ideas?' Well, in that I had no part whatever, being a sub freshman. (In those days, some girls were pledged *before* they were officially enrolled in college.) But the other girls were older and all taking Greek. Minnie Stewart was fairly steeped in Greek mythology—so much so that although her name was Mary McKinney in college, she always was called 'Minnie Minerva.'



Whenever Foster & Gilbert, photographers at Monmouth, Illinois, took this picture Lou Stevenson was 18 years old. It shows her as she looked at the time of her graduation from Monmouth college. In those days Kappa keys were large and flat, and it was the fashion to wear them in the hair, as Lou wore hers.

shaking her finger, said, 'Now girls, remember, these pins are never to be loaned or worn by a boy!'—after which Minnie Stewart said, 'We will make that a law right now.' This we did, and we decided at this time to not wear our pins in public till the charter we had applied for was granted and on record. Then, as Minnie Stewart said, 'We will make our appearance altogether wearing our keys with a legal right from the state to exist.'*

"On October 13, 1870, the six first Kappas went into chapel a little late wearing our badges, and the sensation we made went far beyond our wildest dreams. As things began to quiet down, a tall Beta sitting behind me leaned over my shoulder and exclaimed, 'And they are Greek letters, too!' Then things broke loose again. This Beta was D. R. Miller, later called the Beta poet.

"Scene Third. The first initiation held at Maggie Duer's home. I do not remember the date, but it was after Halloween, (which) only six Kappas celebrated. How well

"Third, I have been asked why we gave up the idea of only taking in girls taking the classical course. I'm not sure, but likely because too few girls took the five-year course to build up a strong chapter. We well knew that in numbers there was strength.

"After the last convention, Mrs. Jones (Georgia Hayden Lloyd-Jones, Fraternity president in 1930) said to me, 'Mrs. Miller, what do you think of all this?' I answered, 'Kappa has grown almost beyond my comprehension.' Mrs. Jones said, 'Yes, Kappa has grown and many new things have been added, and are still being added, but the foundation of Kappa, the fundamentals of Kappa, are exactly the same as you girls planned them in 1869 and 1870.'

"*And so they are.*"

SOME KEYS TO YOUR SECURITY

Never underestimate the value of a key in providing protection for you and your possessions. It's up to you to use it.

A key will lock your car, lock your bike to a rack, lock your room, lock your house, and lock your valuables in a strong box.

But, never leave your keys lying around in your room, and never lend a key to anyone. Keep your keys handy when entering or leaving your car. Have your keys ready before you get to the door of your house. Don't endanger your safety by wasting time in searching through your purse.

Furthermore, a ring of keys clenched in your fist with the keys protruding between your fingers can be an effective weapon should you encounter a would-be assailant.

These admonitions come from chiefs and directors of campus security from Alberta to Alabama and Washington to New Jersey. With campus crimes increasing each year, there is a deep concern for your safety. The experiences of these security officials have led them to the conclusion that no woman on campus can take her safety for granted—she must learn to protect herself. They have recommended some guidelines for women to follow in specific areas of campus life.

What can sororities do to ensure the personal safety of their members? Have officers trained in crime prevention from the local or campus police department make a security survey of the sorority house or residence hall. Follow their recommendations.

Request members of the police department to give talks on self-protection, rape prevention, and safety procedures to ensure that all members are aware of the potential threat of theft and harm. It is imperative to maintain a continuing education program relative to personal security.

Set up a "buddy system" for sisters attending events or working late in campus buildings. If there is a campus escort service, encourage members to use it. Remind members repeatedly of the need for personal security by

keeping doors and windows locked. Provide a screening mechanism for visitors to the sorority, and challenge all strangers and ask their business.

What should a woman do to protect her personal property? Keep the door locked at all times when not in your room. Maintain a detailed inventory of your possessions and a record of the numbers of your credit cards. Engrave major items with an identifiable mark; i.e., driver's license number and state.

Do not leave your purse or billfold lying around, even if you are in the room. When walking, keep a firm grip on your purse. Take your valuables home with you during term breaks. Avoid displaying jewelry or other valuables in circumstances that could lead to others removing them.

Is it wise to carry protective devices? Your No. 1 defense is a good healthy scream. Opinion is divided among security chiefs on carrying such devices as whistles and hatpins. All are against devices which can be classified as weapons, many of which are unlawful. All emphasize that firearms should never be carried.

Mack D. Stanhope, University of Washington crime prevention officer, states, "Fingers are stronger than eyes, knees stronger than groins, shoe soles stronger than shins . . . Protective devices and weapons can be taken away and used against you."

Claude W. Spencer, director of safety and security at Miami University, also points out that statistics have shown that the would-be criminal tends to use hat pins, tear gas and similar weapons against his victim. He recommends that women carry a loud noise-producing instrument which can be squeezed "as the individual female through fright or other reasons" could become mute when confronted by an assailant.

Police Commander Adam J. Zutaut of Michigan State University cautions against wearing a whistle on a chain or string around the neck as the string can be used against the victim. He recommends leaving one hand free of books or packages to carry a whistle or sonic horn. A ball point pen or keys on a rings, or even a textbook offer pro-

tection, according to Zutaut. "A woman's natural protective devices—fingernails, teeth, knees, elbows—are excellent weapons, but must be used with full intent to injure."

When and how should law enforcement personnel be contacted? Any time a woman is a victim of a crime; any time a woman is suspicious of persons, places, or events; any time a woman has cause to be afraid—the police should be contacted immediately by telephone or whatever else might be most expeditious means of contact.

Though a potential threat may be real or imaginary, contact the local law enforcement agency. It is better to be wrong and make a fool of yourself for a moment than be the victim of an attack and suffer a lifetime of regret.

In what area are young women most careless or negligent regarding their personal safety? "Two girls walk a well-lighted path at night. A male stops them to ask questions. They stop—become good Samaritans. Result—they are mugged (assaulted) and robbed."

Robert T. Ochs, assistant vice president of public safety at Rutgers University, cites this example to support his belief that young women "do not accept the potential threat in what appears to be a normal campus incident."

Claude Spencer deplores the tendency of young women "to believe the best in all males; this will include accepting rides, walks, and so forth with total strangers."

Walking alone at night and hitchhiking lead the list of unsafe practices of young women compiled by the security officers. Others include failing to lock doors at night, admitting strangers to their rooms, driving alone in areas that are either not familiar or are remote, wearing provocative clothing, not being alert at all times to potential dangers and problems, and failing to learn how to protect themselves through organized programs of law enforcement agencies.

WHAT SHOULD A COLLEGIAN DO TO PROTECT HERSELF IN THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS?

As a pedestrian on campus—Do not walk alone, especially at night. Use public walks on well-lighted streets. Avoid shortcuts, isolated or seldom travelled areas. Walk on the curb side of the walk, not next to buildings or shrubbery. If someone approaches you in a car, walk in the opposite direction the car is facing. If you feel you are being followed, head toward the nearest busy place where there are other people. Dress for safety: avoid tight clothing and wear shoes in which you can run if necessary.

As a driver or passenger in an automobile—Keep your gas tank filled and your car in good running order. Keep your doors locked and windows up while driving. Keep your purse out of sight. Park in a lighted area. If you think someone is watching or waiting for you, lean on the horn. Lock your car when leaving it, and look in the back seat before re-entering it. Do not pick up hitchhikers. Use pre-designated routes when travelling and, if possible, telephone ahead so someone will know when to expect you and to alert authorities if you do not arrive.

As a bike rider on campus—Use the same precautions as for a pedestrian. Ride on well-lighted, frequently travelled paths and streets. Ride with one or more bikers, if possible. Use bike racks and locking systems. Avoid using your bike during the hours of darkness.

As a spectator at campus events—Do not go alone. Sit with friends. Do not become involved with strangers or unruly crowds. Stay away from secluded areas of a stadium or athletic facility. Do not go alone to restroom facilities. Avoid anyone drinking or distributing narcotics. Do not leave with people you do not know. Arrange ahead of time for return transportation if the event is not within walking distance.

As a student using a campus building—Abide by the rules and regulations of the building. Know the location of all exits and public telephones. At night, utilize only those buildings designated for student use during the hours of darkness. Travel to and from such buildings with friends or an escort.

Do not stay in a building alone after hours. If you must work in an office after hours, notify campus security. Tell a friend where you are going to be and when you will be leaving. Lock the office door and do not open the door or admit anyone without first securing proper identification—this also applies to service and custodial personnel. Do not prop doors open for friends who may be joining you later.

As a resident of a sorority house or dormitory—Know the emergency numbers of the fire and police departments. Lock your door when sleeping or absent from your room. Be sure to use your shades and blinds—do not walk around partially clothed or nude if there is any way someone can see you. Don't stay in the laundry room alone if the house or dorm is open to outsiders.

If residing on the ground floor or in below ground level rooms, be sure that security locks are installed on all windows and security screens installed with non-removable screws. Make it a habit to identify yourself when entering another's room and to expect anyone entering your room to do the same. Cooperate in maintaining visitation rules and hours.

This information was compiled in answer to a request to the National Panhellenic Editors Conference from Barbara Elsbury, assistant dean of students at Purdue University and co-chairperson of the NPC/NAWDAC Liaison Committee. At a meeting of the Committee last year, members agreed that there should be a strengthening of efforts in reminding sorority women of safety and security concerns and issues.

With the assistance of Gail Wade, chief of the police department at the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, questionnaires were distributed at the 1978 meeting of the International Association of College University Security Directors Conference in Quebec City, Canada. The answers of the security directors to a variety of questions provided much of the information used here.

Though only 45 in paid membership, these women are delighted to have a chapter nearby and have worked hard to help the colony and make the installation a memorable occasion. Registration and hospitality were headed by Alden Tucker Scarborough, ΓΨ—Maryland, who is no stranger to Kappa organizing, having served as Beta Province Meeting treasurer when Harrisburg was hostess in 1973. Handling the checkbook and financial arrangements was Barbara Stutzman Hawley, ΔΦ—Bucknell.

A cheery fire in the lovely home of Francis Black Betts, ΔA—Penn State, was a welcome setting for Fireside Service. The quiet ritual was soon replaced by a happy din as initiates and visitors became acquainted and enjoyed a reception co-hosted by Joanne Robb Ambrose, ΔA—Penn State, and Helen Pfund Ward, BB^Δ—St. Lawrence.

Carlisle is an attractive town with a rather old-fashioned square at its hub. On one corner of the square is St. John's Episcopal Church, site of the initiation. Jean Ebright Elin, BN—Ohio State, and Dinnie Texter Callahan, BM—Colorado, drove from Headquarters in our blue and blue van and performed their customary magic act of setting the scene and arranging the equipment for what proved to be a beautiful initiation ceremony.

Gifts from alumnae included a kitchen shower, and several pieces of furniture from the recently closed Beta Alpha Chapter at the University of Pennsylvania were welcome additions.

Still riding high on a bubble of excitement, Kappas picked up their long skirts and stepped over puddles to return to campus for the Installation Banquet. A lovely setting and delicious dinner were arranged by Ann Walthall Kittredge, ΓΛ—Middlebury, banquet chairman. Sally Goas topped her role as installation chairman with her warm welcome as toastmistress. A special greeting and toast to the new chapter was given by Meg Saul, president of Delta Phi Chapter, Bucknell, and a gracious response came from Mary Beth Monahan, Epsilon Omega president. Greetings were sent by individuals and groups throughout the province and nation and Gay Barry read many of them to the 200 guests. Dean Mary Watson Carson, Associate Dean of Students and a member of Delta Delta Delta, welcomed Kappa on behalf of the college. Everyone who was even remotely involved with the colonization and installation knew how helpful she had been and how her personal assistance had helped to smooth the way for us.

Sighs of appreciation greeted the opening of presents from alumnae, active chapters and individuals who sent thoughtful gifts to celebrate the event. A very special moment was the chapter's presentation of a gift to Dusty Elias, their graduate counselor. Showing their love and appreciation for her, they referred to Dusty as their "Kappa jewel" and gave her a

lovely ring of sapphire surrounded by tiny diamonds.

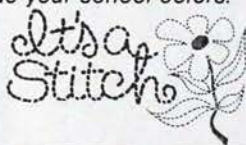

Wittenberg University students observed a week (hopefully habit-forming) which featured Munchless Monday (no vending machines, corn poppers, etc.), Tuneless Tuesday (no radios or stereos), Washerless Wednesday, TV-less Thursday (to encourage groupwatching on a single television set), Fridgeless Friday (no refrigerators), and Shadowless Saturday (minimum lights).

BELLS TOLL at 11:30 a.m. every Thursday at Denison University to call students and faculty to the Common Hour, a time to bring together the members of the Denison community, an hour long presentation on the work and contributions of students and faculty. No classes may be scheduled to conflict.

SPECIAL SERVICES offered by educational institutions to communities have become a firmly entrenched way of academic life—and in the intercollegiate world are nearly as competitive as rival athletic teams. An act of the Oregon legislature has established on the University of Oregon campus a Center for Displaced Homemakers, a place for those who because of death, divorce or the illness of a spouse need help in coping with the loss of family income and/or the problems of a life alone.

ASSASSINATION GAMES are cropping up on several campuses, says *On Campus Report*. "Using water pistols or rubber dart guns, students stalk one another for the kill and the sole survivor is declared the winner. The rules of the game, which can go on for days, usually allow a hit to be scored only when fewer than three witnesses are present."

WITH YEARBOOKS a thing of the past on many campuses, the University of North Carolina/Chapel Hill staff found itself with a surplus. Purchasers (4,900 of them) were invited to stop by the yearbook office and pick up a \$2 refund.

ALUMNI COLLEGES—under whatever name, a one- or two-week vacation-learning time at the alma mater—continue to grow in popularity across the country. Among this year's unique offerings: West Georgia College calls it "Fun and Fitness after Fifty" and restricts attendance to those over 50 years of age for a week of emphasis of learning more about health, fitness, and leisure time.

THE PAPER SHORTAGE is being felt by the academic world, according to *The Chronical of Higher Education*. Stem-

ming the flow of paper through mimeograph and copying machines is the goal of paper-saving programs noted across the country—copying on both sides of the paper, greater use of blackboards, eliminating the making of copies of material for each student are some of the recommended remedies.

DIRTY BOOK SALE was the way the University of Kentucky Press announced its offering of damaged and soiled books. The advertising ploy worked, and more than \$3,000 worth of books were sold in two days.

COLLEGE ENROLLMENTS for fall, 1978 were down one-half of one percent over 1977. The greatest decrease was among full-time students at four-year institutions. Part-time enrollments, especially among women, showed an increase though these part-timers are taking fewer courses. Drop-outs—and how to prevent a temporary or permanent "vacation" from college—continue to concern educators.

CAMPUS PROTEST may have declined but is hardly extinct, according to *On Campus Report*. The range of campus causes have, however, increased to cover everything from University of Alaska students protesting off-shore oil drilling to "ticket protests" by students unable to gain admission to athletic contests which had been sold out.

A STUDENT LABOR POOL at Duke University has saved the university \$130,000 a year while at the same time creating jobs worth \$200,000 for participating students. The operation began seven years ago when a group of students contracted to clean up the football stadium and now employs 320 students in temporary, part-time jobs ranging from janitorial to secretarial services.

RESCUE SQUAD run by student volunteers at Kent State has proved an unqualified success during its eight years in operation. Between 11 and 16 minutes is shaved off ambulance response time as the Volunteer Ambulance Service operates out of the Health Center basement, each of the 60 to 100 volunteers being required to complete the state emergency medical technician's course offered at Kent each quarter. The service exists on student government allocations of \$6,000-\$8,000 annually.
