




SAME PATIO, SAME BRICKS...NEW SYSTEM

The exhibit *Tradition of Leadership – Education to Enfranchisement* is being expanded! Phase one covered the history of Kappa Kappa Gamma in the context of women's history from 1870—920. Phase two is in development and will be debuted at the 2014 General Convention in Houston, Texas. With another dynamic script written by Museums Committee member and Smithsonian Curator Emerita, Edith Petersilia Mayo, *George Washington*, we once again are working with designer Doug Distel to bring the exhibit to life. This new segment is titled *Tradition of Leadership – Enfranchisement to Employment* and will shed light on the years 1920—1970; the period of the flapper, the backlash to early feminism, dramatic expansion in Kappa and the continually changing roles of women. After the initial opening at Convention, both segments of the exhibit will be available for rental once again. These displays are perfect for chapter recruitment events,

association events, community historical societies, libraries, and college or university gallery exhibitions. Help us share the incredible story of women's history and women in higher education with the community!

TUNE IN!

In January 2013, C-SPAN announced an ambitious programming schedule of specials devoted to the first ladies of the United States. It airs on Monday evenings at 9:00 p.m. Eastern time and our own Edith Petersilia Mayo, *George Washington*, consults on the show and has appeared several times to provide her expertise on the first ladies. Currently in its second season, there are only three episodes left, culminating with Michelle Obama on February 10th at 9:00 p.m. Eastern time.
